A BILL

To amend the Controlled Substances Act (21 U.S.C. 848) to provide increased penalties for methamphetamine traffickers.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Increased Penalties
5 for Methamphetamine Traffickers Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES ACT AMENDMENT.**

2 Section 408 of the Controlled Substances Act (21
3 U.S.C. 848) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
4 lowing:

5 “(s) SPECIAL PROVISION FOR METHAMPHET-
6 AMINE.—For the purposes of subsection (b), in the case
7 of continuing criminal enterprise involving methamphet-
8 amine or its salts, isomers, or salts of isomers, paragraph
9 (2)(A) shall be applied by substituting ‘100’ for ‘300’, and
10 paragraph (2)(B) shall be applied by substituting
11 ‘\$1,000,000’ for ‘\$10 million dollars.’”.
