### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Veterans Access to5 Health Care Act".

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### 1 SEC. 2. VETERANS BENEFICIARY TRAVEL.

2 (a) ELIMINATION OF DEDUCTIBLE.—Section 111(c)
3 of title 38, United States Code, is repealed.

4 (b) DETERMINATION OF MILEAGE REIMBURSEMENT
5 RATE.—Section 111(g) of such title is amended—

6 (1) in paragraph (1), to read as follows:

7 "(1)(A) In determining the amount of allowance or
8 reimbursement to be paid under this section, the Secretary
9 shall use the House of Representatives mileage reimburse10 ment rate.

11 "(B) For purposes of this section, the term 'House of Representatives mileage reimbursement rate' means the 12 13 maximum mileage reimbursement rate for Members of the House of Representatives established by the Committee on 14 House Administration of the House of Representatives 15 16 pursuant to House Resolution 457, Ninety-second Congress, agreed to July 21, 1971, as enacted into permanent 17 18 law by chapter IV of the Supplemental Appropriations 19 Act, 1972 (2 U.S.C. 57)."; and

20 (2) by striking paragraphs (3) and (4).

(c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
this Act shall apply with respect to travel expenses incurred after the expiration of the 60-day period that begins on the date of the enactment of this Act.
