A BILL

To require the Secretary of Energy to conduct a study on the potential fuel savings from intelligent transportation systems that help businesses and consumers to plan their travel and avoid delays.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Fuel Savings, Smarter
- 5 Travel, and Efficient Roadways Act".

1 SEC. 2. STUDY OF FUEL SAVINGS FROM INTELLIGENT

2 TRANSPORTATION SYSTEMS.

3 Not later than 2 years after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Energy shall, in consultation 4 5 with the Secretary of Transportation, report to Congress on the potential fuel savings from intelligent transpor-6 7 tation systems that help businesses and consumers to plan their travel and avoid delays. These systems may include web-based real-time transit information systems, congestion information systems, carpool information systems, 10 11 parking information systems, freight route management, and traffic management systems. The report shall include 12 13 analysis of fuel savings, analysis of system costs, assessment of local, State, and regional differences in applica-15 bility, and evaluation of case studies, best practices, and emerging technologies from both the private and public 17 sector.
