A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to improve the management of information technology within the Department of Veterans Affairs by providing for the Chief Information Officer of that Department to have authority over resources, budget, and personnel related to the support function of information technology, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Department of Vet5 erans Affairs Information Technology Management Im6 provement Act of 2005".

SEC. 2. MANAGEMENT OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY IN BEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS.

9 (a) RESOURCES, BUDGET, AND PERSONNEL AU10 THORITY OF CHIEF INFORMATION OFFICER.—Section
11 310 of title 38, United States Code, is amended by adding
12 at the end the following new subsections:

13 "(c) To support the economical, efficient, and effec-14 tive execution of the information technology objectives, 15 policies, and plans of the Department in support of De-16 partment goals, the Secretary shall ensure that the Chief Information Officer has the authority and control nec-17 essary for the development, approval, implementation, in-18 19 tegration, and oversight of policies, procedures, processes, 20 activities, and systems of the Department relating to the 21 management of information technology for the Department, including the management of all related mission ap plications, information resources, personnel, and infra structure.

4 "(d)(1) The Secretary, acting through the Chief In5 formation Officer, shall develop, implement, and maintain
6 a process for the selection and oversight of information
7 technology for the Department.

8 "(2) As components of the development of the process
9 required by paragraph (1), the Secretary shall develop for
10 the Department—

11 "(A) an information technology strategic plan12 that includes performance measurements; and

13 "(B) an integrated enterprise architecture.

"(3) The information technology strategic plan shall
set forth a multiyear plan for the use of information technology and related resources to support the accomplishment of the Department's mission.

18 "(4) The Chief Information Officer shall review and 19 update the information technology strategic plan and the 20 integrated enterprise architecture on an ongoing basis to 21 maintain the currency of the plan and the currency of the 22 enterprise architecture with technological changes and 23 changing mission needs of the Department.

24 "(e)(1) Funds may be obligated for information tech-25 nology for the Department only in accordance with the

process implemented under paragraph (1) or as otherwise
 specifically authorized or delegated by the Chief Informa tion Officer or as otherwise directed by the Secretary.

4 "(2)(A) Amounts appropriated for the Department
5 for any fiscal year that are available for information tech6 nology shall be allocated within the Department, con7 sistent with the provisions of appropriations Acts, in such
8 manner as may be specified by, or approved by, the Chief
9 Information Officer.

10 "(B) If for any fiscal year amounts referred to in subparagraph (A) that are available for the Veterans Health 11 12 Administration (or are otherwise available for functions 13 relating to medical care) are to be allocated under subparagraph (A) in a manner that is inconsistent with the 14 15 allocation method known as the Veterans Equitable Resource Allocation, such allocation may be made only with 16 the approval of the Secretary and after the Under Sec-17 retary for Health is notified. 18

19 "(3) When the budget for any fiscal year is submitted 20 by the President to Congress under section 1105 of title 21 31, the Secretary shall submit to Congress a report that 22 identifies amounts requested for information technology 23 for the Department. The report shall set forth those 24 amounts both for each Administration within the Depart-25 ment and for the Department in the aggregate and shall identify, for each such amount, how that amount is
 aligned with and supports the information technology stra tegic plan under subsection (d), as then in effect.

4 "(f)(1) The Chief Information Officer shall select the
5 Chief Information Officer for each of the Veterans Health
6 Administration, the Veterans Benefits Administration,
7 and the National Cemetery Administration. Any such se8 lection may only be made after consultation with the
9 Under Secretary with responsibility for the Administration
10 for which the selection is to be made.

11 "(2) Each Administration Chief Information Officer
12 selected under paragraph (1)—

13 "(A) shall be designated as a Department Dep14 uty Chief Information Officer; and

15 "(B) shall report to the Department Chief In-16 formation Officer.

"(3) The Department Deputy Chief Information Officers are responsible for implementing in their respective
Administrations, as directed by the Department Chief Information Officer, the information technology strategic
plan and the integrated enterprise architecture developed
for the Department by the Department Chief Information
Officer pursuant to subsection (d)(2).

24 "(4) To accomplish the policies, programmatic goals,25 information technology system acquisitions, and align-

ments prescribed, authorized, or directed by the Depart ment Chief Information Officer, each Department Deputy
 Chief Information Officer shall maintain, for their respec tive Administrations, operational control of all information
 technology system assets and personnel necessary, includ ing direct management of the Administration's software
 and applications development activities.

8 "(5) The Department Deputy Chief Information Offi-9 cers—

"(A) shall be the principal advocate for the information technology needs of their respective Administrations; and

"(B) shall assure, by coordinating with the Department Chief Information Officer, that the business and mission needs of their respective Administrations are met by considering requirements at all
levels.

18 "(g)(1) The Secretary shall ensure that the annual 19 report submitted by the Secretary pursuant to section 20 11313 of title 40 includes an identification of any obliga-21 tion approved by the Chief Information Officer under sub-22 section (e)(1), including the date, amount, and purpose 23 of such obligation.

24 "(2) The Secretary shall submit to the Committees25 on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and House of Rep-

resentatives an annual report, not later than March 1 of
 each year (beginning in 2009), providing the Secretary's
 assessment of the implementation during the year covered
 by the report of the provisions of subsections (c), (d), and
 (e). Each such report shall include—

6 "(A) the assessment of the Secretary as to in-7 creased efficiency within the Department of informa-8 tion technology acquisition processes, management, 9 responsibility, and accountability as a result of those 10 provisions; and

11 "(B) estimated cost savings to the Department12 as a result of those provisions.

13 "(h) In this section, the term 'information tech14 nology' has the meaning given that term in paragraph (6)
15 of section 11101 of title 40.".

16 (b) Reports to Congress on Implementation.—

17 (1) PERIODIC PROGRESS REPORTS.—

(A) REPORTS REQUIRED.—The Secretary
of Veterans Affairs shall submit to Congress
progress reports on the implementation of subsections (c), (d), and (e), of section 310 of title
38, United States Code, as added by subsection
(a).

24 (B) TIME FOR PROGRESS REPORTS.—A re25 port under subparagraph (A) shall be submitted

1 as expeditionally as feasible after the end of the 2 60-day period, the 90-day period, and the 180-3 day period beginning on the date of the enact-4 ment of this Act. 5 (C) MATTER TO BE INCLUDED.—Each re-6 port under this paragraph shall set out the 7 progress to date on the implementation of the 8 provisions specified in subparagraph (A). 9 (2) INTERIM REPORTS.—After the completion 10 of the first 12 months, and after the completion of 11 the first 18 months, of the implementation of the 12 provisions specified in paragraph (1)(A), the Sec-13 retary shall submit to Congress an interim report on 14 the operation of those provisions to that date. Each 15 such report shall include the following: 16 (A) The assessment of the Secretary as to 17 increased efficiency within the Department of 18 Veterans Affairs of information technology ac-19 quisition processes, management, responsibility, 20 and accountability. 21 (B) Estimated cost savings to the Depart-22 ment as a result of those provisions. 23 FINAL IMPLEMENTATION REPORT.—Not (3)24 later than January 1, 2008, the Secretary shall sub-25 mit to Congress a final report on the implementation

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of the provisions specified in paragraph (1)(A). The
 Secretary shall include in that report the matters
 specified in paragraph (2) and the Secretary's rec ommendation for any modifications to information
 technology management within the Department of
 Veterans Affairs.
