To designate Pakistan under section 244 of the Immigration and Nationality Act to permit nationals of Pakistan to be eligible for temporary protected status under such section.

Mr. AL GREEN of Texas (for himself, Mr. POE, Mr. CROWLEY, Mr. GRIJALVA, Ms. KILPATRICK of Michigan, Mr. MEEKS of New York, Ms. SCHAKOWSKY, and Ms. JACKSON-LEE of Texas) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

## A BILL

- To designate Pakistan under section 244 of the Immigration and Nationality Act to permit nationals of Pakistan to be eligible for temporary protected status under such section.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Pakistani Temporary
- 5 Protected Status Act of 2005".

#### 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

7 Congress finds the following:

1	(1) On October 8, 2005, a magnitude 7.6 earth-
2	quake struck Pakistan.
3	(2) In Pakistan, more than 40,000 people are
4	known dead.
5	(3) Immediately following the earthquake, near-
6	ly 3 million people were living in tents or in the open
7	air amid freezing temperatures, having been left
8	homeless by the earthquake.
9	(4) The earthquake damaged sanitation systems
10	in the region, destroyed hospitals, and left many vic-
11	tims with no access to clean drinking water, making
12	them more vulnerable to disease.
13	(5) According to the United Nations, more than
14	a million people are in acute need of assistance in
15	the quake zone.
16	(6) Temporary protected status allows aliens
17	who do not legally qualify as refugees but are none-
18	theless fleeing or reluctant to return to potentially
19	dangerous situations to temporarily remain in the
20	United States.
21	(7) Granting temporary protected status to na-
22	tionals of Pakistan is consistent with the interests of
23	the United States and promotes the values and mor-
24	als that have made the United States strong.

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#### 1 SEC. 3. SENSE OF CONGRESS.

It is the sense of Congress that the extraordinary and temporary conditions caused by the earthquake in Pakistan qualifies Pakistan for designation under subparagraphs (B) or (C) of section 244(b)(1) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1254a(b)(1)), pursuant to which nationals of Pakistan would be eligible for temporary protected status in the United States.

# 9 SEC. 4. DESIGNATION FOR PURPOSES OF GRANTING TEM10 PORARY PROTECTED STATUS.

11 (a) DESIGNATION.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—For purposes of section 244
of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
1254a), Pakistan shall be treated as if it had been
designated under subsection (b) of such section, subject to the provisions of this section.

17 (2) PERIOD OF DESIGNATION.—The initial pe18 riod of such designation shall begin on the date of
19 the enactment of this Act and shall remain in effect
20 for 12 months.

(b) ALIENS ELIGIBLE.—In applying section 244 of
such Act pursuant to the designation made under this section, subject to section 244(c)(3) of such Act, an alien who
is a national of Pakistan is deemed to satisfy the requirements of section 244(c)(1) of such Act only if the alien—

(1) has been continuously physically present in 2 the United States since October 8, 2005;

3 (2) is admissible as an immigrant, except as 4 otherwise provided under section 244(c)(2)(A) of 5 such Act, and is not ineligible for temporary pro-6 tected status under section 244(c)(2)(B) of such 7 Act; and

8 (3) registers for temporary protected status in 9 a manner that the Secretary of Homeland Security 10 shall establish.

11 (c) CONSENT TO TRAVEL ABROAD.—The Secretary 12 of Homeland Security shall give the prior consent to travel 13 abroad described in section 244(f)(3) of such Act to an alien who is granted temporary protected status pursuant 14 15 to the designation made under this section, if the alien establishes to the satisfaction of the Secretary of Home-16 land Security that emergency and extenuating cir-17 cumstances beyond the control of the alien require the 18 alien to depart for a brief, temporary trip abroad. An alien 19 20 returning to the United States in accordance with such 21 an authorization shall be treated the same as any other 22 returning alien provided temporary protected status under 23 section 244 of such Act.

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
