2 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. 2 This Act may be cited as the "Passport for All Act 3 of 2005". 4 SEC. 2. ELIMINATING AUTHORITY TO WAIVE PASSPORT RE-5 QUIREMENTS. 6 (a) FOR IMMIGRANT ALIENS.—Section 212 of the Immigration and Nationality Act is amended— 8 (1) in subsection (a)(7)(A)(i)(I) by striking "or other suitable travel document" and all that follows 9 10 through "title,"; and 11 (2) in subsection (k) by inserting "and a valid 12 unexpired passport" after "an immigrant visa". 13 (b) FOR NONIMMIGRANT ALIENS.—Section 212 of the Immigration and Nationality Act is amended in subsection (d)(4) by striking "Either or both of the require-15 ments of paragraph (7)(B)(i)" and inserting "The requirement of paragraph (7)(B)(i)(II)". 17 18 (c) For Citizens.—Section 215(b) of the Immigra-19 tion and Nationality Act is amended— 20 (1) by striking "Except as otherwise provided 21 by the President and subject to the such limitations 22 and exceptions as the President may authorize and 23 prescribe, it" and inserting "It";

(2) by striking the period at the end and insert-

ing ", except as provided by the President—"; and

8	this section take effect on January 1, 2008.
9	SEC. 3. ELIMINATING TRAVEL DOCUMENT PLAN TO CON-
10	FORM WITH ELIMINATION OF AUTHORITY TO
11	WAIVE PASSPORT REQUIREMENTS.
12	Section 7209 of the Intelligence Reform and Ter-
13	rorism Prevention Act of 2004 is amended—
14	(1) by striking subsection (b) and (c);
15	(2) by redesignating subsection (d) as sub-
16	section (c); and
17	(3) by inserting after subsection (a) the fol-
18	lowing new subsection:
19	"(b) Requirement to Produce Documenta-
20	TION.—Not later than January 1, 2008, the Secretary of
21	Homeland Security shall require all United States citizens
22	and aliens to carry and produce a passport when travelling
23	from foreign countries into the United States, except as
24	provided by the President under section 215(b) of the Im-
25	migration and Nationality Act.".

1	SEC. 4. ENDEAVORING TO ACHIEVE UNIFORMITY IN
2	ISSUANCE OF MACHINE-READABLE PASS-
3	PORTS.
4	(a) In General.—Beginning not later than 180
5	days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-
6	retary of State shall endeavor to persuade all countries,
7	through diplomacy and consultation, to issue machine-
8	readable passports which comply with applicable document
9	identifying standards established by the International
10	Civil Aviation Organization.
11	(b) Annual Report.—
12	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of State shall
13	submit an annual report to Congress on the progress
14	achieved under subsection (a).
15	(2) Contents of Report.—Each such report
16	shall include—
17	(A) a list of countries that issue machine-
18	readable passports complying with the stand-
19	ards described in subsection (a); and
20	(B) if there are any countries that do not
21	issue such machine-readable passports, a de-
22	scription of any barriers that specific countries
23	face in the issuance of such machine-readable
24	passports.
