PLACEMENT OF STATUE OF ROSA PARKS IN NA-2 TIONAL STATUARY HALL. 3 (a) Obtaining Statue.—Not later than 2 years after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Joint Com-4 5 mittee on the Library shall enter into an agreement to obtain a statue of Rosa Parks, under such terms and con-7 ditions as the Joint Committee considers appropriate con-8 sistent with applicable law. 9 (b) PLACEMENT.—The Joint Committee shall place the statue obtained under subsection (a) in the United 10 11 States Capitol in a suitable permanent location in Na-12 tional Statuary Hall. SEC. 2. ELIGIBILITY FOR PLACEMENT OF STATUES IN NA-14 TIONAL STATUARY HALL. 15 (a) Eligibility.—No statue of any individual may be placed in National Statuary Hall until after the expiration of the 10-year period which begins on the date of the individual's death. 18 19 (b) Exceptions.—Subsection (a) does not apply with respect to— 20 21 (1) the statue obtained and placed in National 22 Statuary Hall under this Act; or 23 (2) any statue provided and furnished by a 24 State under section 1814 of the Revised Statutes of 25 the United States (2 U.S.C. 2131) or any replace-
