A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to transfer ownership of the American River Pump Station Project, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "American River Pump
- 5 Station Project Transfer Act of 2005".
- 6 SEC. 2. AUTHORITY TO TRANSFER.
- 7 The Secretary of the Interior (hereafter in this Act
- 8 referred to as the "Secretary") shall transfer ownership
- 9 of the American River Pump Station Project located at
- 10 Auburn, California, which includes the Pumping Plant, as-

- 1 sociated facilities, and easements necessary for permanent
- 2 operation of the facilities, to the Placer County Water
- 3 Agency, in accordance with the terms of Contract No. 02–
- 4 LC-20-7790 between the United States and Placer Coun-
- 5 ty Water Agency and the terms and conditions established
- 6 in this Act.

7 SEC. 3. FEDERAL COSTS NONREIMBURSABLE.

- 8 Federal costs associated with construction of the
- 9 American River Pump Station Project located at Auburn,
- 10 California, are nonreimbursable.

11 SEC. 4. GRANT OF REAL PROPERTY INTEREST.

- 12 The Secretary is authorized to grant title to Placer
- 13 County Water Agency as provided in section 2 in full satis-
- 14 faction of the United States' obligations under Land Pur-
- 15 chase Contract 14–06–859–308 to provide a water supply
- 16 to the Placer County Water Agency.

17 SEC. 5. COMPLIANCE WITH ENVIRONMENTAL LAWS.

- 18 (a) IN GENERAL.—Before conveying land and facili-
- 19 ties pursuant to this Act, the Secretary shall comply with
- 20 all applicable requirements under—
- 21 (1) the National Environmental Policy Act of
- 22 1969 (42 U.S.C. 4321 et seq.);
- 23 (2) the Endangered Species Act of 1973 (16
- 24 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.); and

- 1 (3) any other law applicable to the land and facilities.
- 3 (b) Effect.—Nothing in this Act modifies or alters
- 4 any obligations under—
- 5 (1) the National Environmental Policy Act of
- 6 1969 (42 U.S.C. 4321 et seq.); or
- 7 (2) the Endangered Species Act of 1973 (16)
- 8 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.).

9 SEC. 6. RELEASE FROM LIABILITY.

- 10 Effective on the date of transfer to the Placer County
- 11 Water Agency of any land or facility under this Act, the
- 12 United States shall not be liable for damages arising out
- 13 of any act, omission, or occurrence relating to the land
- 14 and facilities, consistent with Article 9 of Contract No.
- 15 02-LC-20-7790 between the United States and Placer
- 16 County Water Agency.
