  - 6 purposes of the Defense Access Road Program, the roads
  - 7 described in subsection (b) in the vicinity of Fort Belvoir,
  - 8 Virginia, are hereby certified to the Secretary of Defense
- 9 and the Secretary of Transportation as important to the

- 1 national defense pursuant to section 210 of title 23,
- 2 United States Code.
- 3 (b) COVERED ROADS.—The certification made by
- 4 subsection (a) applies to those portions of the following
- 5 roads in the vicinity of Fort Belvoir:
- 6 (1) Interstate highway I–95.
- 7 (2) Virginia Route 7100 (Fairfax County Park-
- $8 \quad \text{way}$ ).
- 9 (3) U.S. Route 1 (Richmond Highway).
- 10 (4) Virginia Route 611(Telegraph Road).
