AN ACT

6 tions for military personnel; operation and maintenance;
7 Overseas Humanitarian, Disaster, and Civic Aid; procure-
8 ment; research, development, test and evaluation; and de-
9 fense working capital funds to accomplish the purposes
10 provided herein: *Provided further,* That this transfer au-
11 thority is in addition to any other transfer authority avail-
12 able to the Department of Defense: *Provided further,* That
13 upon a determination that all or part of the funds so
14 transferred from this appropriation are not necessary for
15 the purposes provided herein, such amounts may be trans-
16 ferred back to this appropriation: *Provided further,* That

16 heading is designated as an emergency requirement pursu-
17 ant to section 402 of H. Con. Res. 95 (109th Congress),

20 REVOLVING AND MANAGEMENT FUNDS

21 DEFENSE WORKING CAPITAL FUNDS

22 For an additional amount for “Defense Working
23 Capital Funds”, \$502,700,000: *Provided*, That the
24 amount provided under this heading is designated as an
25 emergency requirement pursuant to section 402 of H.

3 OTHER DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE PROGRAMS

4 DEFENSE HEALTH PROGRAM

5 For an additional amount for “Defense Health Pro-
6 gram”, \$1,153,562,000 (reduced by \$20,000,000) (in-
7 creased by \$20,000,000) for operation and maintenance:
8 *Provided*, That the amount provided under this heading
9 is designated as an emergency requirement pursuant to
10 section 402 of H. Con. Res. 95 (109th Congress), the con-
11 current resolution on the budget for fiscal year 2006.

12 DRUG INTERDICTION AND COUNTER-DRUG ACTIVITIES,

13 DEFENSE

14 (INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

15 For an additional amount for “Drug Interdiction and
16 Counter-Drug Activities, Defense”, \$156,800,000, to re-
17 main available until expended: *Provided*, That these funds
18 may be used only for such activities related to Afghanistan
19 and the Central Asia area: *Provided further*, That the Sec-
20 retary of Defense may transfer such funds only to appro-
21 priations for military personnel; operation and mainte-
22 nance; procurement; and research; development; test and
23 evaluation: *Provided further*, That the funds transferred
24 shall be merged with and be available for the same pur-
25 poses and for the same time period as the appropriation

1 to which transferred: *Provided further*, That the transfer
2 authority provided in this paragraph is in addition to any
3 other transfer authority available to the Department of
4 Defense: *Provided further*, That upon a determination that
5 all or part of the funds transferred from this appropriation
6 are not necessary for the purposes provided herein, such
7 amounts may be transferred back to this appropriation:
8 *Provided further*, That the amount provided under this
9 heading is designated as an emergency requirement pursu-
10 ant to section 402 of H. Con. Res. 95 (109th Congress);
11 the concurrent resolution on the budget for fiscal year
12 2006.

13 OFFICE OF THE INSPECTOR GENERAL

14 For an additional amount for “Office of the Inspector
15 General”, \$6,120,000, to remain available until September
16 30, 2007: *Provided*, That the amount provided under this
17 heading is designated as an emergency requirement pursu-
18 ant to section 402 of H. Con. Res. 95 (109th Congress);
19 the concurrent resolution on the budget for fiscal year
20 2006.

21 RELATED AGENCIES

22 INTELLIGENCE COMMUNITY MANAGEMENT ACCOUNT

23 For an additional amount for the “Intelligence Com-
24 munity Management Account”, \$158,875,000: *Provided*,
25 That the amount provided under this heading is des-

1 ignated as an emergency requirement pursuant to section
2 402 of H. Con. Res. 95 (109th Congress), the concurrent
3 resolution on the budget for fiscal year 2006.

4 GENERAL PROVISIONS—THIS CHAPTER

5 (TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

6 SEC. 1201. Upon his determination that such action
7 is necessary in the national interest, the Secretary of De-
8 fense may transfer between appropriations up to
9 \$2,000,000,000 of the funds made available to the De-
10 partment of Defense in this chapter: *Provided*, That the
11 Secretary shall notify the Congress promptly of each
12 transfer made pursuant to this authority: *Provided further*,
13 That the transfer authority provided in this section is in
14 addition to any other transfer authority available to the
15 Department of Defense: *Provided further*, That the au-
16 thority in this section is subject to the same terms and
17 conditions as the authority provided in section 8005 of the
18 Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2006, except
19 for the fourth proviso.

20 SEC. 1202. (a) AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE SUP-
21 PORT.—Of the amount appropriated by this Act under the
22 heading “Drug Interdiction and Counter-Drug Activities,
23 Defense”, not to exceed \$40,000,000 may be made avail-
24 able for support for counter-drug activities of the Govern-
25 ments of Afghanistan and Pakistan: *Provided*, That such

1 support shall be in addition to support provided for the
2 counter-drug activities of such Governments under any
3 other provision of the law.

4 (b) TYPES OF SUPPORT.—(1) Except as specified in
5 subsections (b)(2) and (b)(3) of this section, the support
6 that may be provided under the authority in this section
7 shall be limited to the types of support specified in section
8 1033(e)(1) of the National Defense Authorization Act for
9 Fiscal Year 1998 (Public Law 105–85, as amended by
10 Public Law 106–398 and Public Law 108–136), and con-
11 ditions on the provision of support as contained in such
12 section 1033 shall apply for fiscal year 2006.

13 (2) The Secretary of Defense may transfer vehicles,
14 aircraft, and detection, interception, monitoring and test-
15 ing equipment to such Governments for counter-drug ac-
16 tivities.

17 (3) For the Government of Afghanistan, the Sec-
18 retary of Defense may also provide individual and crew-
19 served weapons, and ammunition for counter-drug secu-
20 rity forces.

21 SEC. 1203. Notwithstanding 10 U.S.C. 2208(1), the
22 total amount of advance billings rendered or imposed for
23 all working capital funds of the Department of Defense
24 in fiscal year 2006 shall not exceed \$1,500,000,000. *Pro-*
25 *vided,* That the amounts made available pursuant to this

1 section are designated as an emergency requirement pur-
2 suant to section 402 of H. Con. Res. 95 (109th Congress),
3 the concurrent resolution on the budget for fiscal year
4 2006.

5 SEC. 1204. In addition to amounts authorized in sec-
6 tion 1202(a) of Public Law 109-163, from funds made
7 available in this chapter to the Department of Defense,
8 not to exceed \$423,000,000 may be used to fund the Com-
9 mander's Emergency Response Program and for a similar
10 program to assist the people of Afghanistan, to remain
11 available until December 31, 2007.

12 SEC. 1205. Supervision and administration costs as-
13 sociated with a construction project funded with "Afghani-
14 stan Security Forces Fund" or "Iraq Security Forces
15 Fund" appropriations may be obligated at the time a con-
16 struction contract is awarded: *Provided*, That for the pur-
17 pose of this section, supervision and administration costs
18 include all in-house Government costs.

19 SEC. 1206. None of the funds provided in this chap-
20 ter may be used to finance programs or activities denied
21 by Congress in fiscal year 2005 and 2006 appropriations
22 to the Department of Defense or to initiate a procurement
23 or research, development, test and evaluation new start
24 program without prior written notification to the congres-
25 sional defense committees.

17 or order to active duty under a provision of law referred
18 to in section 101(a)(13)(B) of title 10 shall be entitled, while
19 serving on active duty, to receive, for each pay period de-
20 scribed in subsection (b), an amount equal to the amount
21 by which—

22 “(1) the amount of basic pay which would other-
23 wise have been payable to such employee for such pay
24 period if such employee’s civilian employment with
25 the Government had not been interrupted by that
26 service, exceeds (if at all)

1 “(2) the amount of pay and allowances which
2 (as determined under subsection (d))—

3 “(A) is payable to such employee for that
4 service; and

5 “(B) is allocable to such pay period.

6 “(b)(1) Amounts under this section shall be payable
7 with respect to each pay period (which would otherwise
8 apply if the employee’s civilian employment had not been
9 interrupted)—

10 “(A) during which such employee is entitled to
11 reemployment rights under chapter 43 of title 38 with
12 respect to the position from which such employee is
13 absent (as referred to in subsection (a)); and

14 “(B) for which such employee does not otherwise
15 receive basic pay (including by taking any annual,
16 military, or other paid leave) to which such employee
17 is entitled by virtue of such employee’s civilian em-
18 ployment with the Government.

19 “(2) For purposes of this section, the period during
20 which an employee is entitled to reemployment rights under
21 chapter 43 of title 38—

22 “(A) shall be determined disregarding the provi-
23 sions of section 4312(d) of title 38; and

24 “(B) shall include any period of time specified
25 in section 4312(e) of title 38 within which an em-

1 *ployee may report or apply for employment or reem-*
2 *ployment following completion of service on active*

19 *(3) The President on February 6, 2006, included*
20 *a \$50,000,000,000 allowance for ongoing military op-*
21 *erations in fiscal year 2007, but did not formally re-*
22 *quest the funds or provide any detail on how the al-*
23 *lowance may be used.*

24 *(4) The concurrent resolution on the budget for*
25 *fiscal year 2007, as agreed to in the Senate on March*

1 16, 2007, anticipates as much as \$86,300,000,000 in
2 emergency spending in fiscal year 2007, indicating
3 that the Senate expects to take up another supple-
4 mental appropriations bill to fund ongoing military
5 operations during fiscal year 2007.

6 (b) *SENSE OF SENATE.*—It is the sense of the Senate
7 that—

8 (1) any request for funds for a fiscal year after
9 fiscal year 2007 for ongoing military operations in
10 Afghanistan and Iraq should be included in the an-
11 nual budget of the President for such fiscal year as
12 submitted to Congress under section 1105(a) of title
13 31, United States Code;

14 (2) any request for funds for such a fiscal year
15 for ongoing military operations should provide an es-
16 timate of all funds required in that fiscal year for
17 such operations;

18 (3) any request for funds for ongoing military
19 operations should include a detailed justification of
20 the anticipated use of such funds for such operations;
21 and

22 (4) any funds provided for ongoing military op-
23 erations overseas should be provided in appropria-
24 tions Acts for such fiscal year through appropriations

1 to specific accounts set forth in such appropriations
2 Acts.

3 SEC. 1314. (a) The amount appropriated by this chap-

19 *ed to serve in those countries, furnishing expertise to*
20 *their counterpart agencies in the Government of Iraq*
21 *and the Government of Afghanistan.*

22 *(2) While the heads of a number of Federal agen-*
23 *cies already possess authority to provide to their per-*
24 *sonnel on official duty abroad allowances, benefits,*
25 *and death gratuities comparable to those provided by*
26 *the Secretary of State to similarly-situated Foreign*

1 *Service personnel on official duty abroad, other agen-*
2 *cy heads do not possess such authority.*

3 (3) *In order to assist the United States Govern-*
4 *ment in recruiting personnel to serve in Iraq and Af-*
5 *ghanistan, and to avoid inequities in allowances, ben-*
6 *efits, and death gratuities among similarly-situated*
7 *United States Government civilian personnel on offi-*
8 *cial duty in these countries, it is essential that the*
9 *heads of all agencies that have personnel on official*
10 *duty in Iraq and Afghanistan have the same basic*
11 *authority with respect to allowances, benefits, and*
12 *death gratuities for such personnel.*

13 (b) *IN GENERAL.*—*During any fiscal year, the head*
14 *of an agency may, in the agency head's discretion, provide*
15 *to an individual employed by, or assigned or detailed to,*
16 *such agency allowances, benefits, and gratuities comparable*
17 *to those provided by the Secretary of State to members of*
18 *the Foreign Service under section 413 and chapter 9 of title*
19 *I of the Foreign Service Act of 1980 (22 U.S.C. 3973; 4081*
20 *et seq.), if such individual is on official duty in Iraq or*
21 *Afghanistan.*

22 (c) *CONSTRUCTION.*—*Nothing in this section shall be*
23 *construed to impair or otherwise affect the authority of the*
24 *head of an agency under any other provision of law.*

1 (d) *APPLICABILITY OF CERTAIN AUTHORITIES.*—Sec-
2 tion 912(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 shall
3 apply with respect to amounts received as allowances or
4 otherwise under this section in the same manner as section
5 912 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 applies with re-
6 spect to amounts received by members of the Foreign Service
7 as allowances or otherwise under chapter 9 of title I of the
8 Foreign Service Act of 1980.

9 *DEMOCRACY IN IRAQ*

10 *SEC. 1407. (a) Of the funds provided in this chapter*
11 *for the Economic Support Fund, not less than \$104,500,000*
12 *should be made available through the Bureau of Democracy,*
13 *Human Rights, and Labor of the Department of State, in*
14 *coordination with the United States Agency for Inter-*
15 *national Development where appropriate, to United States*
16 *nongovernmental organizations for the purpose of sup-*
17 *porting democracy assistance programs in Iraq that pro-*
18 *mote the long term development of civil society, political*
19 *parties, election processes, the rule of law, reconciliation ac-*
20 *tivities, and parliament in that country: Provided, That*
21 *the Secretary of State shall consult with the Committees on*
22 *Appropriations prior to the initial obligation of funds made*
23 *available under this section on the uses of such funds: Pro-*
24 *vided further, That of the funds made available under this*
25 *heading, up to \$8,500,000 should be made available for the*

1 *United States Institute of Peace for programs in Iraq and*
2 *Afghanistan.*

3 *(b) The President shall include in each report sub-*
4 *mitted to Congress under the United States Policy in Iraq*
5 *Act (section 1227 of Public Law 109–163; 50 U.S.C. 1541*
6 *note; 119 Stat. 3465) a report on the extent to which funds*
7 *appropriated in this Act support a short-term and long-*
8 *term strategy to promote and develop democracy in Iraq,*
9 *including:*

10 *(1) A description of the objectives of the Sec-*
11 *retary of State to promote and develop democracy at*
12 *the national, regional, and provincial levels in Iraq,*
13 *including development of civil society, political par-*
14 *ties, and government institutions.*

15 *(2) The schedule to achieve such objectives.*

16 *(3) The progress made toward achieving such ob-*
17 *jectives.*

18 *(4) The principal official within the United*
19 *States Government responsible for coordinating and*
20 *implementing democracy funding for Iraq.*

21 *(RESCISSION)*

4 **SEC. 3001. SHORT TITLE.**

5 *This title may be cited as the “Emergency Agricultural*
6 *Disaster Assistance Act of 2006”.*

7 **SEC. 3002. DEFINITIONS.**

8 *In this title:*

9 (1) *ADDITIONAL COVERAGE.*—*The term “addi-*
10 *tional coverage” has the meaning given the term in*
11 *section 502(b)(1) of the Federal Crop Insurance Act*
12 *(7 U.S.C. 1502(b)(1)).*

13 (2) *DISASTER COUNTY.*—*The term “disaster*
14 *county” means—*

15 (A) *a county included in the geographic*
16 *area covered by a natural disaster declaration;*
17 *and*

18 (B) *each county contiguous to a county de-*
19 *scribed in subparagraph (A).*

20 (3) *HURRICANE-AFFECTED COUNTY.*—*The term*
21 *“hurricane-affected county” means—*

22 (A) *a county included in the geographic*
23 *area covered by a natural disaster declaration*
24 *related to Hurricane Katrina, Hurricane Rita,*
25 *Hurricane Wilma, or a related condition; and*

1 (B) each county contiguous to a county de-
2 scribed in subparagraph (A).

3 (4) *INSURABLE COMMODITY*.—The term “insur-
4 able commodity” means an agricultural commodity
5 (excluding livestock) for which the producers on a
6 farm are eligible to obtain a policy or plan of insur-
7 ance under the *Federal Crop Insurance Act* (7 U.S.C.
8 1501 *et seq.*).

9 (5) *LIVESTOCK*.—The term “livestock” in-
10 cludes—

11 (A) cattle (including dairy cattle);

12 (B) bison;

13 (C) sheep;

14 (D) swine; and

15 (E) other livestock, as determined by the
16 Secretary.

17 (6) *NATURAL DISASTER DECLARATION*.—The
18 term “natural disaster declaration” means—

19 (A) a natural disaster declared by the Sec-
20 retary—

21 (i) during calendar year 2005 under
22 section 321(a) of the *Consolidated Farm*
23 and *Rural Development Act* (7 U.S.C.
24 1961(a)); or

1 (ii) during calendar year 2006 under
2 that section, but for which a request was
3 pending as of the date of enactment of this
4 Act; or

5 (B) a major disaster or emergency des-
6 ignated by the President—

7 (i) during calendar year 2005 under
8 the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and
9 Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5121
10 et seq.); or

11 (ii) during calendar year 2006 under
12 that Act, but for which a request was pend-
13 ing as of the date of enactment of this Act.

14 (7) *NONINSURABLE COMMODITY.*—The term
15 “noninsurable commodity” means a crop for which
16 the producers on a farm are eligible to obtain assist-
17 ance under section 196 of the Federal Agriculture Im-
18 provement and Reform Act of 1996 (7 U.S.C. 7333).

19 (8) *SECRETARY.*—The term “Secretary” means
20 the Secretary of Agriculture.

21 **Subtitle A—Agricultural**
22 **Production Losses**

23 **SEC. 3011. CROP DISASTER ASSISTANCE.**

24 (a) *IN GENERAL.*—The Secretary shall use such sums
25 as are necessary of funds of the Commodity Credit Corpora-

1 *tion to make emergency financial assistance authorized*
2 *under this section available to producers on a farm that*
3 *have incurred qualifying losses described in subsection (c).*

4 *(b) ADMINISTRATION.—*

5 *(1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in para-*
6 *graph (2), the Secretary shall make assistance avail-*
7 *able under this section in the same manner as pro-*
8 *vided under section 815 of the Agriculture, Rural De-*
9 *velopment, Food and Drug Administration and Re-*
10 *lated Agencies Appropriations Act, 2001 (Public Law*
11 *106–387; 114 Stat. 1549A–55), including using the*
12 *same loss thresholds for quantity and economic losses*
13 *as were used in administering that section, except*
14 *that the payment rate shall be 50 percent of the estab-*
15 *lished price, instead of 65 percent.*

16 *(2) LOSS THRESHOLDS FOR QUALITY LOSSES.—*
17 *In the case of a payment for quality loss for a crop*
18 *under subsection (c)(2), the loss thresholds for quality*
19 *loss for the crop shall be determined under subsection*
20 *(d).*

21 *(c) QUALIFYING LOSSES.—Assistance under this sec-*
22 *tion shall be made available to producers on farms, other*
23 *than producers of sugar cane and sugar beets, that incurred*
24 *qualifying quantity or quality losses for—*

1 (1) *the 2005 crop due to damaging weather or*
2 *any related condition (including losses due to crop*
3 *diseases, insects, and delayed harvest), as determined*
4 *by the Secretary; and*

5 (2) *the 2006 crop due to flooding in California*
6 *and Hawaii that occurred prior to the date of enact-*
7 *ment of this Act and for which a petition for a dis-*
8 *aster designation has been filed with the Secretary*
9 *not later than that date.*

10 *(d) QUALITY LOSSES.—*

11 (1) *IN GENERAL.—Subject to paragraph (3), the*
12 *amount of a payment made to producers on a farm*
13 *for a quality loss for a crop under subsection (c)(2)*
14 *shall be equal to the amount obtained by multi-*
15 *plying—*

16 (A) *65 percent of the payment quantity de-*
17 *termined under paragraph (2); by*

18 (B) *50 percent of the payment rate deter-*
19 *mined under paragraph (3).*

20 (2) *PAYMENT QUANTITY.—For the purpose of*
21 *paragraph (1)(A), the payment quantity for quality*
22 *losses for a crop of a commodity on a farm shall*
23 *equal the lesser of—*

1 (A) the actual production of the crop af-
2 fectured by a quality loss of the commodity on the
3 farm; or

4 (B) the quantity of expected production of
5 the crop affected by a quality loss of the com-
6 modity on the farm, using the formula used by
7 the Secretary to determine quantity losses for the
8 crop of the commodity under subsection (c)(1).

9 (3) *PAYMENT RATE*.—For the purpose of para-
10 graph (1)(B) and in accordance with paragraphs (5)
11 and (6), the payment rate for quality losses for a crop
12 of a commodity on a farm shall be equal to the dif-
13 ference between—

14 (A) the per unit market value that the units
15 of the crop affected by the quality loss would
16 have had if the crop had not suffered a quality
17 loss; and

18 (B) the per unit market value of the units
19 of the crop affected by the quality loss.

20 (4) *ELIGIBILITY*.—For producers on a farm to be
21 eligible to obtain a payment for a quality loss for a
22 crop under subsection (c)(2), the amount obtained by
23 multiplying the per unit loss determined under para-
24 graph (1) by the number of units affected by the qual-
25 ity loss shall be at least 25 percent of the value that

1 *all affected production of the crop would have had if*
2 *the crop had not suffered a quality loss.*

3 (5) *MARKETING CONTRACTS.*—*In the case of any*
4 *production of a commodity that is sold pursuant to*
5 *1 or more marketing contracts (regardless of whether*
6 *the contract is entered into by the producers on the*
7 *farm before or after harvest) and for which appro-*
8 *priate documentation exists, the quantity designated*
9 *in the contracts shall be eligible for quality loss assist-*
10 *ance based on the 1 or more prices specified in the*
11 *contracts.*

12 (6) *OTHER PRODUCTION.*—*For any additional*
13 *production of a commodity for which a marketing*
14 *contract does not exist or for which production con-*
15 *tinues to be owned by the producer, quality losses*
16 *shall be based on the average local market discounts*
17 *for reduced quality, as determined by the appropriate*
18 *State committee of the Farm Service Agency.*

19 (7) *QUALITY ADJUSTMENTS AND DISCOUNTS.*—
20 *The appropriate State committee of the Farm Service*
21 *Agency shall identify the appropriate quality adjust-*
22 *ment and discount factors to be considered in car-*
23 *rying out this subsection, including—*

24 (A) *the average local discounts actually ap-*
25 *plied to a crop; and*

1 (B) *the discount schedules applied to loans*
2 *made by the Farm Service Agency or crop insur-*
3 *ance coverage under the Federal Crop Insurance*
4 *Act (7 U.S.C. 1501 et seq.).*

5 (8) *ELIGIBLE PRODUCTION.*—*The Secretary shall*
6 *carry out this subsection in a fair and equitable man-*
7 *ner for all eligible production, including the produc-*
8 *tion of fruits and vegetables, other specialty crops,*
9 *and field crops.*

10 (e) *ELIGIBILITY FOR ASSISTANCE.*—

11 (1) *IN GENERAL.*—*Except as provided in para-*
12 *graph (2), the producers on a farm shall not be eligi-*
13 *ble for assistance under this section with respect to*
14 *losses to an insurable commodity or noninsurable*
15 *commodity if the producers on the farm—*

16 (A) *in the case of an insurable commodity,*
17 *did not obtain a policy or plan of insurance for*
18 *the insurable commodity under the Federal Crop*
19 *Insurance Act (7 U.S.C. 1501 et seq.) for the*
20 *crop incurring the losses;*

21 (B) *in the case of a noninsurable com-*
22 *modity, did not file the required paperwork, and*
23 *pay the administrative fee by the applicable*
24 *State filing deadline, for the noninsurable com-*
25 *modity under section 196 of the Federal Agri-*

1 *culture Improvement and Reform Act of 1996 (7*
2 *U.S.C. 7333) for the crop incurring the losses;*

3 *(C) had average adjusted gross income (as*
4 *defined by section 1001D(a) of the Food Security*
5 *Act of 1985 (7 U.S.C. 1308–3a(a)), of greater*
6 *than \$2,500,000 in 2004; or*

7 *(D) were not in compliance with highly*
8 *erodible land conservation and wetland conserva-*
9 *tion provisions.*

10 (2) *CONTRACT WAIVER.—The Secretary may*
11 *waive paragraph (1) with respect to the producers on*
12 *a farm if the producers enter into a contract with the*
13 *Secretary under which the producers agree—*

14 *(A) in the case of an insurable commodity,*
15 *to obtain a policy or plan of insurance under the*
16 *Federal Crop Insurance Act (7 U.S.C. 1501 et*
17 *seq.) providing additional coverage for the insur-*
18 *able commodity for each of the next 2 crops, at*
19 *a coverage level that provides—*

20 *(i) not less than 65 percent of the ac-*
21 *tual production history for the crop pro-*
22 *duced on the farm; and*

23 *(ii) 100 percent of the expected market*
24 *price or a comparable coverage (as deter-*

1 *mined by the Federal Crop Insurance Cor-*
2 *poration); and*

3 *(B) in the case of a noninsurable com-*
4 *modity, to file the required paperwork and pay*
5 *the administrative fee by the applicable State fil-*
6 *ing deadline, for the noninsurable commodity for*
7 *each of the next 2 crops under section 196 of the*
8 *Federal Agriculture Improvement and Reform*
9 *Act of 1996 (7 U.S.C. 7333).*

10 *(3) EFFECT OF VIOLATION.—In the event of the*
11 *violation of a contract under paragraph (2) by a pro-*
12 *ducer, the producer shall reimburse the Secretary for*
13 *the full amount of the assistance provided to the pro-*
14 *ducer under this section.*

15 *(f) TIMING.—*

16 *(1) IN GENERAL.—Subject to paragraph (2), the*
17 *Secretary shall make payments to producers on a*
18 *farm for a crop under this section not later than 60*
19 *days after the date the producers on the farm submit*
20 *to the Secretary a completed application for the pay-*
21 *ments.*

22 *(2) INTEREST.—If the Secretary does not make*
23 *payments to the producers on a farm by the date de-*
24 *scribed in paragraph (1), the Secretary shall pay to*
25 *the producers on a farm interest on the payments at*

1 *a rate equal to the current (as of the sign-up deadline*
2 *established by the Secretary) market yield on out-*
3 *standing, marketable obligations of the United States*
4 *with maturities of 30 years.*

5 **SEC. 3012. LIVESTOCK ASSISTANCE.**

6 *(a) LIVESTOCK COMPENSATION PROGRAM.—*

7 *(1) USE OF COMMODITY CREDIT CORPORATION*
8 *FUNDS.—Effective beginning on the date of enactment*
9 *of this Act, the Secretary shall use funds of the Com-*
10 *modity Credit Corporation to carry out the 2002*
11 *Livestock Compensation Program announced by the*
12 *Secretary on October 10, 2002 (67 Fed. Reg. 63070),*
13 *to provide compensation for livestock losses during*
14 *calendar years 2005 and 2006 for losses that occurred*
15 *prior to the date of enactment of this Act (including*
16 *wildfire disaster losses in the State of Texas and other*
17 *States) due to a disaster, as determined by the Sec-*
18 *retary, except that the payment rate shall be 75 per-*
19 *cent of the payment rate established for the 2002*
20 *Livestock Compensation Program.*

21 *(2) ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS.—In carrying out the*
22 *program described in paragraph (1), the Secretary*
23 *shall provide assistance to any applicant that—*

24 *(A)(i) conducts a livestock operation that is*
25 *located in a disaster county, including any ap-*

1 *plicant conducting a livestock operation with eli-*
2 *gible livestock (within the meaning of the live-*
3 *stock assistance program under section 101(b) of*
4 *division B of Public Law 108–324 (118 Stat.*
5 *1234)); or*

6 *(ii) produces an animal described in section*
7 *10806(a)(1) of the Farm Security and Rural In-*
8 *vestment Act of 2002 (21 U.S.C. 321d(a)(1));*
9 *and*

10 *(B) meets all other eligibility requirements*
11 *established by the Secretary for the program.*

12 *(3) MITIGATION.—In determining the eligibility*
13 *for or amount of payments for which a producer is*
14 *eligible under the livestock compensation program, the*
15 *Secretary shall not penalize a producer that takes ac-*
16 *tions (recognizing disaster conditions) that reduce the*
17 *average number of livestock the producer owned for*
18 *grazing during the production year for which assist-*
19 *ance is being provided.*

20 *(4) LIMITATION.—The Secretary shall ensure, to*
21 *the maximum extent practicable, that no producer on*
22 *a farm receives duplicative payments under this sub-*
23 *section and another Federal program with respect to*
24 *any loss.*

25 *(b) LIVESTOCK INDEMNITY PAYMENTS.—*

1 (1) *IN GENERAL.*—*The Secretary shall use such*
2 *sums as are necessary of funds of the Commodity*
3 *Credit Corporation to make livestock indemnity pay-*
4 *ments to producers on farms that have incurred live-*
5 *stock losses during calendar years 2005 and 2006 for*
6 *losses that occurred prior to the date of enactment of*
7 *this Act (including wildfire disaster losses in the*

12 *producer on a farm under paragraph (1) shall be*
13 *made at a rate of not less than 30 percent of the mar-*
14 *ket value of the applicable livestock on the day before*
15 *the date of death of the livestock, as determined by the*
16 *Secretary.*

17 (c) *LIVESTOCK INDEMNITY PROGRAM FOR CONTRACT*
18 *GROWERS.*—

19 (1) *IN GENERAL.*—*Subject to subsection (d), the*
20 *Secretary shall use funds of the Commodity Credit*
21 *Corporation to establish a program to assist poultry*
22 *producers in hurricane-affected counties that suffered*
23 *income losses.*

24 (2) *TERMS AND CONDITIONS.*—*The program es-*
25 *tablished under paragraph (1) shall contain similar*

2 *used for the livestock indemnity program for contract*

6 *(d) EWE LAMB REPLACEMENT AND RETENTION.—*

7 *(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall use*
8 *\$15,000,000 of funds of the Commodity Credit Cor-*
9 *poration to make payments under the Ewe Lamb Re-*
10 *placement and Retention Payment Program under*
11 *part 784 of title 7, Code of Federal Regulations (or*
12 *a successor regulation) for each qualifying ewe lamb*
13 *retained or purchased during the period beginning on*
14 *January 1, 2006, and ending on December 31, 2006.*

15 *(2) INELIGIBILITY FOR OTHER ASSISTANCE.—A*
16 *producer that receives assistance under this subsection*
17 *shall not be eligible to receive assistance under sub-*
18 *section (a).*

19 *(e) LIMIT ON AMOUNT OF ASSISTANCE.—The Sec-*
20 *retary shall ensure, to the maximum extent practicable, that*
21 *no producer on a farm receives duplicative payments under*
22 *this section and any other Federal program for the same*
23 *loss.*

1 **SEC. 3013. FLOODED CROP AND GRAZING LAND.**

2 (a) *IN GENERAL.*—*The Secretary shall compensate eli-*
3 *gible owners of flooded crop and grazing land in—*

4 (1) *the Devils Lake basin; and*

5 (2) *the McHugh, Lake Laretta, and Rose Lake*
6 *closed drainage areas of the State of North Dakota.*

7 (b) *ELIGIBILITY.*—

8 (1) *IN GENERAL.*—*To be eligible to receive com-*
9 *penetration under this section, an owner shall own land*
10 *described in subsection (a) that, during the 2 crop*
11 *years preceding receipt of compensation, was rendered*
12 *incapable of use for the production of an agricultural*
13 *commodity or for grazing purposes (in a manner con-*
14 *sistent with the historical use of the land) as the re-*
15 *sult of flooding, as determined by the Secretary.*

16 (2) *INCLUSIONS.*—*Land described in paragraph*
17 *(1) shall include—*

18 (A) *land that has been flooded;*

19 (B) *land that has been rendered inaccessible*
20 *due to flooding; and*

21 (C) *a reasonable buffer strip adjoining the*
22 *flooded land, as determined by the Secretary.*

7 (c) *SIGN-UP.—The Secretary shall establish a sign-up*
8 *program for eligible owners to apply for compensation from*
9 *the Secretary under this section.*

10 (d) *COMPENSATION PAYMENTS.—*

11 (1) *IN GENERAL.—Subject to paragraphs (2) and*
12 *(3), the rate of an annual compensation payment*
13 *under this section shall be equal to 90 percent of the*
14 *average annual per acre rental payment rate (at the*
15 *time of entry into the contract) for comparable crop*

7 *tablished under the Federal Crop Insurance Act*
8 *(7 U.S.C. 1501 et seq.);*

9 (B) *the noninsured crop assistance program*
10 *established under section 196 of the Federal Ag-*
11 *riculture Improvement and Reform Act of 1996*
12 *(7 U.S.C. 7333); or*

13 (C) *any Federal agricultural crop disaster*
14 *assistance program.*

15 (e) *RELATIONSHIP TO AGRICULTURAL COMMODITY*
16 *PROGRAMS.*—*The Secretary, by regulation, shall provide*
17 *for the preservation of cropland base, allotment history, and*
18 *payment yields applicable to land described in subsection*
19 *(a) that was rendered incapable of use for the production*
20 *of an agricultural commodity or for grazing purposes as*
21 *the result of flooding.*

22 (f) *USE OF LAND.*—

23 (1) *IN GENERAL.*—*An owner that receives com-*
24 *ensation under this section for flooded land shall*
25 *take such actions as are necessary to not degrade any*

1 *wildlife habitat on the land that has naturally devel-*
2 *oped as a result of the flooding.*

3 (2) *RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES.*—*To encourage*
4 *owners that receive compensation for flooded land to*
5 *allow public access to and use of the land for rec-*
6 *reational activities, as determined by the Secretary,*
7 *the Secretary may—*

8 (A) *offer an eligible owner additional com-*
9 *ensation; and*

10 (B) *provide compensation for additional*
11 *acreage under this section.*

12 (g) *FUNDING.*—

13 (1) *IN GENERAL.*—*The Secretary shall use*
14 *\$6,000,000 of funds of the Commodity Credit Cor-*
15 *poration to carry out this section.*

16 (2) *PRO-RATED PAYMENTS.*—*In a case in which*
17 *the amount made available under paragraph (1) for*
18 *a fiscal year is insufficient to compensate all eligible*
19 *owners under this section, the Secretary shall pro-rate*
20 *payments for that fiscal year on a per acre basis.*

21 **SEC. 3014. SUGARCANE AND SUGAR BEET DISASTER ASSIST-**
22 **ANCE.**

23 (a) *FLORIDA.*—*The Secretary of Agriculture shall use*
24 *\$120,000,000 of funds of the Commodity Credit Corporation*
25 *to make payments to processors in Florida that are eligible*

16 (1) *COMPENSATION FOR LOSSES.—The Secretary*
17 *shall use the funds, facilities, and authorities of the*
18 *Commodity Credit Corporation to make \$120,000,000*
19 *in payments to first processors of sugarcane that op-*
20 *erate in a disaster county in Louisiana, or obtain*
21 *sugarcane from a disaster county in Louisiana, and*
22 *that are eligible to obtain a loan under section 156(a)*
23 *of the Federal Agriculture Improvement and Reform*
24 *Act of 1996 (7 U.S.C. 7272(a)), to compensate the*

12 *ducers for individual losses experienced by the*
13 *producers, including losses due to saltwater in-*
14 *trusion, flooding, wind damage, or increased*

25 *to determine crop loss in carrying out the hurricane*

1 *assistance program under section 207 of the Agricul-*
2 *tural Assistance Act of 2003 (Public Law 108–7; 117*
3 *Stat. 543).*

4 *(c) FUNDING.—The Secretary shall use \$40,000,000 of*
5 *funds of the Commodity Credit Corporation to provide as-*
6 *sistance to sugar beet producers that suffered production*
7 *losses (including quality losses) for the 2005 crop year.*

8 *(d) REQUIREMENT.—The Secretary shall make pay-*
9 *ments under subsection (c) in the same manner as pay-*
10 *ments were made under section 208 of the Agricultural As-*
11 *sistance Act of 2003 (Public Law 108–7; 117 Stat. 544),*
12 *including using the same indemnity benefits as were used*
13 *in carrying out that section.*

14 *(e) TEXAS.—The Secretary shall use \$400,000 of funds*
15 *of the Commodity Credit Corporation to assist sugarcane*
16 *growers in Texas by making a payment in that amount*
17 *to the Rio Grande Valley Sugar Growers, a farmer-owned*
18 *cooperative sugarcane processor in that State, for addi-*
19 *tional demurrage costs at the Port of Baton Rouge and ad-*
20 *ditional storage and transportation costs of raw sugar re-*
21 *sulting from hurricanes during calendar year 2005, exces-*
22 *sive rains, floods, wind, and other related conditions.*

23 *(f) HAWAII.—The Secretary shall use \$6,000,000 of*
24 *funds of the Commodity Credit Corporation to assist sugar-*
25 *cane growers in Hawaii by making a payment in that*

1 amount to an agricultural transportation cooperative in
2 Hawaii, the members of which are eligible to receive mar-
3 keting assistance loans and loan deficiency payments made
4 available under subtitle B of title I of the Farm Security

6 (g) *LIMIT ON AMOUNT OF ASSISTANCE.*—The Sec-
7 retary shall ensure, to the maximum extent practicable, that
8 no producer on a farm receives duplicative payments under
9 this section and any other Federal program for the same
10 loss.

11 **SEC. 3015. SPECIALTY CROPS AND NURSERY CROPS.**

12 (a) *IN GENERAL.*—The Secretary shall use funds of the
13 Commodity Credit Corporation to provide assistance to
14 producers of specialty crops and nursery crops in hurri-
15 cane-affected counties.

16 (b) *ADMINISTRATION.*—

17 (1) *IN GENERAL.*—Assistance required by sub-
18 section (a) shall be carried out by the Secretary under
19 the same terms and conditions as the special disaster
20 relief programs carried out for producers that suffered
21 from crop damage and tree losses, and carried out re-
22 lated cleanup, in certain areas of Florida due to Hur-
23 ricanes Charley, Frances, and Jeanne during August
24 and September 2004, as described in the notice of pro-
25 gram implementation relating to Florida citrus, fruit,

1 *vegetable, and nursery crop disaster programs (69*
2 *Fed. Reg. 63134 (October 29, 2004)).*

3 (2) *LOSS OF RECORDS.—Due to the complete de-*
4 *struction of the business records of many producers,*
5 *the Secretary shall use the best available information*
6 *in determining eligibility, determining losses, and*
7 *calculating payment amounts under this section.*

8 (c) *LIMIT ON AMOUNT OF ASSISTANCE.—The Sec-*
9 *retary shall ensure, to the maximum extent practicable, that*
10 *no producer on a farm receives duplicative payments under*
11 *this section and any other Federal program for the same*
12 *loss.*

13 **SEC. 3016. DAIRY ASSISTANCE.**

14 *The Secretary shall use \$25,000,000 of the funds of the*
15 *Commodity Credit Corporation to make payments to dairy*
16 *producers for dairy production losses and dairy spoilage*
17 *losses in hurricane-affected counties.*

18 **SEC. 3017. COTTONSEED.**

19 (a) *DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS.—The Secretary shall*
20 *provide disaster assistance under subsection (c) under the*
21 *same terms and conditions as assistance provided under*
22 *section 206 of the Agricultural Assistance Act of 2003 (Pub-*
23 *lic Law 108–7; 117 Stat. 543), except that assistance shall*
24 *be—*

1 (1) *distributed to producers and first handlers of*
2 *cottonseed; and*

3 (2) *based on cottonseed production during the*
4 *most recent year for which a disaster payment spe-*
5 *cifically for cottonseed was not authorized.*

6 (b) *COTTONSEED ASSISTANCE.—The Secretary shall*
7 *use \$15,000,000 of the funds of the Commodity Credit Cor-*
8 *poration to provide assistance to producers and first-han-*
9 *dlers of the 2005 crop of cottonseed in hurricane-affected*
10 *counties.*

11 **SEC. 3018. REDUCTION IN PAYMENTS.**

12 *The amount of any payment for which a producer is*
13 *eligible under this subtitle shall be reduced by any amount*
14 *received by the producer for the same loss or any similar*
15 *loss under—*

16 (1) *the Department of Defense, Emergency Sup-*
17 *plemental Appropriations to Address Hurricanes in*
18 *the Gulf of Mexico, and Pandemic Influenza Act,*
19 *2006 (Public Law 109–148; 119 Stat. 2680); or*

20 (2) *an agricultural disaster assistance provision*
21 *contained in the announcement of the Secretary on*
22 *January 26, 2006.*

1 ***Subtitle B—Supplemental Nutrition***
2 ***and Agricultural Economic Dis-***
3 ***aster Assistance***

4 **SEC. 3021. REPLENISHMENT OF SECTION 32.**

5 (a) *DEFINITION OF SPECIALTY CROP.—In this section:*

6 (1) *IN GENERAL.—The term “specialty crop”*
7 *means any agricultural crop.*

8 (2) *EXCEPTION.—The term “specialty crop” does*
9 *not include—*

10 (A) *wheat;*

11 (B) *feed grains;*

12 (C) *oilseeds;*

13 (D) *cotton;*

14 (E) *rice; or*

15 (F) *peanuts.*

16 (b) *BASE STATE GRANTS.—*

17 (1) *IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall use*
18 *\$25,500,000 of funds of the Commodity Credit Cor-*
19 *poration to make grants to the several States, the Dis-*
20 *trict of Columbia, and the Commonwealth of Puerto*
21 *Rico to be used to support activities that promote ag-*
22 *riculture.*

23 (2) *AMOUNTS.—The amount of the grants shall*
24 *be—*

1 (A) \$500,000 to each of the several States;

2 and

3 (B) \$250,000 to each of the Commonwealth

4 of Puerto Rico and the District of Columbia.

5 (c) *GRANTS FOR VALUE OF PRODUCTION.*—The Sec-

6 retary shall use \$74,500,000 of funds of the Commodity

7 Credit Corporation to make a grant to each of the several

8 States in an amount equal to the product obtained by mul-

9 tiplied—

10 (1) the share of the State of the total value of

11 specialty crop, livestock, and dairy production of the

12 United States for the 2004 crop year, as determined

13 by the Secretary; by

14 (2) \$74,500,000.

15 (d) *SPECIAL CROP AND LIVESTOCK PRIORITY.*—As a

16 condition on the receipt of a grant under this section, a

17 State shall agree to give priority to the support of specialty

18 crops and livestock in the use of the grant funds.

19 (e) *USE OF FUNDS.*—A State may use funds from a

20 grant awarded under this section—

21 (1) to supplement State food bank programs or

22 other nutrition assistance programs;

23 (2) to promote the purchase, sale, or consump-

24 tion of agricultural products;

1 (3) to provide economic assistance to agricul-
2 tural producers, giving a priority to the support of
3 specialty crops and livestock; or

4 (4) for other purposes as determined by the Sec-
5 retary.

6 **SEC. 3022. SUPPLEMENTAL ECONOMIC LOSS PAYMENTS.**

7 The Secretary shall make a supplemental economic loss
8 payment to any producer on a farm that received a direct
9 payment for crop year 2005 under title I of the Farm Secu-
10 rity and Rural Investment Act of 2002 (7 U.S.C. 7901 et

6 ***Subtitle C—Forestry***

7 ***SEC. 3031. TREE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.***

8 *(a) DEFINITION OF TREE.—In this section, the term*
9 *“tree” includes a tree (including a Christmas tree, orna-*
10 *mental tree, nursery tree, and potted tree), bush (including*
11 *a shrub), and vine.*

12 *(b) PROGRAM.—Except as otherwise provided in this*
13 *section, the Secretary shall use such sums as are necessary*
14 *of the funds of the Commodity Credit Corporation to pro-*
15 *vide assistance under the tree assistance program estab-*
16 *lished under sections 10201 through 10203 of the Farm Se-*
17 *curity and Rural Investment Act of 2002 (7 U.S.C. 8201*
18 *et seq.) to—*

19 *(1) producers who suffered tree losses in hurri-*
20 *cane-affected counties; and*

21 *(2) fruit and tree nut producers in hurricane-af-*
22 *ected counties for site preparation, replacement, re-*
23 *habilitation, and pruning.*

24 *(c) COSTS.—Funds made available under this section*
25 *shall also be made available to cover costs associated with*

1 *tree pruning, tree rehabilitation, and other appropriate*
2 *tree-related activities as determined by the Secretary.*

3 (d) *LIMIT ON AMOUNT OF ASSISTANCE.—The Sec-*
4 *retary shall ensure, to the maximum extent practicable, that*
5 *no producer on a farm receives duplicative payments under*
6 *this section and any other Federal program for the same*
7 *loss.*

8 ***Subtitle D—Conservation***

9 ***SEC. 3041. NATURAL RESOURCES CONSERVATION SERVICE.***

10 (a) *AUTHORITY TO CLEAR DEBRIS AND ANIMAL CAR-*
11 *CASSES.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the*
12 *Secretary, acting through the Natural Resources Conserva-*
13 *tion Service, using funds made available for the emergency*
14 *watershed protection program established under section 403*
15 *of the Agricultural Credit Act of 1978 (16 U.S.C. 2203),*

21 *withstanding any other provision of law, the Secretary, act-*
22 *ing through the Natural Resources Conservation Service,*
23 *may use direct check-writing practices and electronic trans-*
24 *fers to provide financial and technical assistance under the*
25 *emergency watershed protection program established under*

1 *section 403 of the Agricultural Credit Act of 1978 (16*
2 *U.S.C. 2203) in a hurricane-affected county.*

3 **SEC. 3042. EMERGENCY WATERSHED PROTECTION PRO-**
4 **GRAM.**

5 *The Secretary shall use an additional \$108,500,000 of*
6 *funds of the Commodity Credit Corporation to carry out*
7 *emergency measures identified by the Chief of the Natural*
8 *Resources Conservation Service as of the date of enactment*
9 *of this Act through the emergency watershed protection pro-*
10 *gram established under section 403 of the Agricultural*
11 *Credit Act of 1978 (16 U.S.C. 2203).*

12 **SEC. 3043. EMERGENCY CONSERVATION PROGRAM.**

13 *The Secretary shall use an additional \$17,000,000 of*
14 *funds of the Commodity Credit Corporation to carry out*
15 *emergency measures identified by the Administrator of the*
16 *Farm Service Agency as of the date of enactment of this*
17 *Act through the emergency conservation program estab-*
18 *lished under title IV of the Agricultural Credit Act of 1978*
19 *(16 U.S.C. 2201 et seq.).*

20 ***Subtitle E—Farm Service Agency***

21 **SEC. 3051. FUNDING FOR ADDITIONAL PERSONNEL.**

22 *The Secretary shall use \$23,000,000 of funds of the*
23 *Commodity Credit Corporation to hire additional County*
24 *Farm Service Agency personnel—*

1 (1) to expedite the implementation of, and deliv-
2 ery under, the agricultural disaster and economic as-
3 sistance programs under this title; and

4 (2) as the Secretary determines to be necessary
5 to carry out other agriculture and disaster assistance
6 programs.

7 ***Subtitle F—Miscellaneous***

8 **SEC. 3061. AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE IMMUNIZATIONS.**

9 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Sec-
10 retary of Defense may provide immunizations to employees
11 of the Department of Agriculture involved in direct recovery
12 work in a hurricane-affected county.

13 **SEC. 3062. WAIVER OF CERTAIN PROVISIONS.**

14 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Sec-
15 retary may provide assistance in a hurricane-affected coun-
16 ty under the emergency conservation program established
17 under title IV of the Agricultural Credit Act of 1978 (16
18 U.S.C. 2201 et seq.) without regard to subtitle C of title
19 XII of the Food Security Act of 1985 (16 U.S.C. 3821 et
20 seq.).

21 **SEC. 3063. FUNDING.**

22 The Secretary shall use the funds, facilities, and au-
23 thorities of the Commodity Credit Corporation to carry out
24 this title, to remain available until expended.

1 **SEC. 3064. REGULATIONS.**

2 (a) *IN GENERAL.*—*The Secretary may promulgate*
3 *such regulations as are necessary to implement this title.*

4 (b) *PROCEDURE.*—*The promulgation of the regulations*
5 *and administration of this title shall be made without re-*
6 *gard to—*

7 (1) *the notice and comment provisions of section*
8 *553 of title 5, United States Code;*

9 (2) *the Statement of Policy of the Secretary of*
10 *Agriculture effective July 24, 1971 (36 Fed. Reg.*
11 *13804), relating to notices of proposed rulemaking*
12 *and public participation in rulemaking; and*

13 (3) *chapter 35 of title 44, United States Code*
14 *(commonly known as the “Paperwork Reduction*
15 *Act”).*

16 (c) *CONGRESSIONAL REVIEW OF AGENCY RULE-*
17 *MAKING.*—*In carrying out this section, the Secretary shall*
18 *use the authority provided under section 808 of title 5,*
19 *United States Code.*

20 ***Subtitle G—Emergency Designation***
