3 (b) None of the funds appropriated under the heading 4 "Economic Support Fund" in Public Law 109–102 or any 5 prior Act making appropriations for foreign operations, export financing and related programs may be obligated 6 7 or expended for assistance to the West Bank and Gaza 8 until the Secretary of State reviews the current assistance 9 program, consults with the Committees on Appropriations, 10 and submits a revised plan for such assistance: *Provided*, That such plan shall be submitted not later than April 11 12 30, 2006, and shall contain specific and appropriate steps 13 to ensure that United States assistance is not provided to or through any individual, private or government entity, 14 15 or educational institution that the Secretary knows or has reason to believe advocates, plans, sponsors, engages in, 16 17 or has engaged in, terrorist activity.

18 SEC. 3013. None of the funds made available by this 19 Act may be used to prohibit registered and legal, but dis-20 placed, residents of the Gulf Coast region from the right 21 to legally vote in any officially designated election of the 22 Gulf Coast region.

SEC. 3014. None of the funds made available in thisAct may be used by the Government of the United States

to enter into a basing rights agreement between the
 United States and Iraq.

3 This Act may be cited as the "Emergency Supple4 mental Appropriations Act for Defense, the Global War
5 on Terror, and Hurricane Recovery, 2006".
