Ms. CORRINE BROWN of Florida introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

A BILL

To authorize a land conveyance at the former Department of Labor Job Corps Training Center, Jacksonville, Florida.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. LAND CONVEYANCE FORMER DEPARTMENT OF

4 LABOR JOB CORPS TRAINING CENTER, JACK5 SONVILLE, FLORIDA.

6 (a) CONVEYANCE AUTHORIZED.—Notwithstanding 7 any other provision of law, including any other law which 8 requires that property of the United States be used for 9 a particular purpose, the Administrator of General Serv-10 ices shall convey for municipal government purposes, including economic development, the property described in
 subsection (c) to the City of Jacksonville, Florida.

3 (b) CONDITION OF CONVEYANCE.—A conveyance of
4 property authorized under section 1 shall be subject to the
5 condition that—

6 (1) the conveyance shall be by Quitclaim deed;
7 (2) use of the property and facilities conveyed
8 under that section is for economic development pur9 poses;

10 (3) the conveyance shall be with monetary con-11 sideration; and

(4) the conveyance is subject to such other
terms and conditions as the Administrator considers
appropriate to protect the interests of the United
States.

(c) ADDITIONAL TERM.—No conveyance shall be
made until the existing leasehold interest to said property
entered into by the Department of Health and Human
Services has expired or is terminated by mutual agreement.

(d) PROPERTY DESCRIBED.—The property referred
to in subsection (a) known as the Department of Labor
Job Corps Training Center located in the State of Florida,
Duval County, improved with 3 buildings which is legally
described as follows:

1	(1) All of Lot Three (3), except the Easterly
2	Twelve (12) feet of the Westerly One Hundred Thir-
3	ty-seven (137) feet thereof, all of Lot Four (4), the
4	South Half (S–1/2) of lot Eleven (11), all of Lots
5	Twelve (12), Thirteen (13), Fourteen (14), and Fif-
6	teen (15), all in Block Nine (9), of Springfield, ac-
7	cording to plat thereof recorded in plat book 2, page
8	5, of the current public records of Duval County,
9	Florida, together with the closed portion of that cer-
10	tain alley shown on said plat bounded on the North
11	by the Southerly line of said Lot Twelve (12) and
12	bounded on the South by the Northerly line of lots
13	Thirteen (13), Fourteen (14), and Fifteen (15), all
14	in said Block Nine (9), said the portion being that
15	part of said alley which extends Westerly from Silver
16	Street and lies between the Westerly line of said Lot
17	Fifteen (15), as projected Northerly across said
18	alley, and that certain closed alley in said block nine
19	(9), shown on said plat lying between said Lots
20	Three (3) and Twelve (12) .
