A BILL

To require the Secretary of Homeland Security to hire additional full-time non-supervisory import specialists of the Bureau of Customs and Border Protection, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REQUIREMENT TO HIRE ADDITIONAL FULL-**
4 **TIME IMPORT SPECIALISTS OF THE BUREAU**
5 **OF CUSTOMS AND BORDER PROTECTION.**

6 (a) REQUIREMENT.—The Secretary of Homeland Se-
7 curity shall—

1 “(3) CERTIFICATION.—The Secretary of Home-
2 land Security shall certify to the Committee on
3 Ways and Means of the House of Representatives
4 and the Committee on Finance of the Senate for
5 each fiscal year that—

6 “(A) the requirement of paragraph (1) was
7 met during such fiscal year; and

8 “(B) the number of full-time non-super-
9 visory import specialists of the Bureau of Cus-
10 toms and Border Protection during such fiscal
11 year was at least 1,080, as required by para-
12 graph (1).”.

13 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The certification require-
14 ment of paragraph (3) of section 412(b) of the Homeland
15 Security Act of 2002 (as added by subsection (a)) applies
16 with respect to fiscal year 2007 and each subsequent fiscal
17 year.
