A BILL

To establish a volunteer program and promote community partnerships for the benefit of national fish hatcheries and fisheries program offices.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "National Fish Hatch-
- 5 ery System Volunteer Act of 2006".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSES.
- 7 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:
- 8 (1) The National Fish Hatchery System (in this
- 9 Act referred to as the "System")—

1	(A) consists of more than 60 hatcheries
2	seven fish technology centers, 9 fish health cen
3	ters, and other fisheries program offices;
4	(B) plays an integral role in the recovery
5	of more than 50 threatened species and endan
6	gered species and the restoration of over 100
7	native species;
8	(C) provides healthy fish populations that
9	support recreational fishing opportunities, many
10	of which are related to Federal water contro
11	structures; and
12	(D) works with over 250 partners to help
13	mitigate the impacts of aquatic habitat loss and
14	invasive species.
15	(2) The System faces many challenges, includ
16	ing aging facilities, some of which date back to the
17	late 1800s, and maintenance of intensive infrastruc
18	tures such as wells, pumps, valves, pipes, filters
19	heaters, chillers, and treatment systems that mus-
20	keep clean water moving 24 hours a day, 365 days
21	a year.
22	(3) By encouraging volunteer programs and do
23	nations and fostering non-Federal partnerships with
24	hatchery facilities, Federal funding for the hatch

eries can be supplemented.

- 1 (4) By encouraging hatchery educational pro-2 grams, public awareness of the resources of the Sys-3 tem and public participation in the conservation of 4 aquatic resources can be promoted.
- 5 (b) Purposes.—The purposes of this Act are the following:
- 7 (1) To encourage the use of volunteers to assist 8 the United States Fish and Wildlife Service in the 9 management of hatcheries within the System.
 - (2) To facilitate partnerships between the System and non-Federal entities to promote public awareness of the resources of the System and public participation in the conservation of those resources.
- 14 (3) To encourage donations and other contribu-15 tions by individuals and organizations to the System.

16 SEC. 3. GIFTS TO SYSTEM AND PARTICULAR NATIONAL 17 FISH HATCHERIES.

- 18 (a) Authorization of Gifts, Devises, and Be-
- 20 this Act, the Secretary of the Interior may accept any

QUESTS FOR SYSTEM.—In furtherance of the purposes of

- 21 gifts, devises, or bequests of real and personal property,
- 22 or proceeds therefrom, or interests therein, for the benefit
- 23 of the National Fish Hatchery System. Such acceptance
- 24 may be subject to the terms of any restrictive or affirma-
- 25 tive covenant, or condition of servitude, if such terms are

- 1 deemed by the Secretary to be in accordance with law and
- 2 compatible with the purpose for which acceptance is
- 3 sought.

- 4 (b) Use of Gifts, Devises, and Bequests.—
- 5 (1) IN GENERAL.—Any gifts and bequests of
 6 money and proceeds from the sales of other property
 7 received as gifts or bequests pursuant to this sub8 section shall be deposited in a separate account in
 9 the Treasury and may be expended without further
 10 appropriation by the Secretary for the benefit of the
 11 System programs administered by the United States
 12 Fish and Wildlife Service.
 - (2) Gifts, devises, and bequests for particular facilities.—
 - (A) DISBURSAL.—Any gift, devise, or bequest made for the benefit of a facility of the System shall be disbursed only for the benefit of that facility and without further appropriations.
 - (B) Matching.—Subject to the availability of appropriations and the requirements of the Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act (16 U.S.C 661 et seq.) and other applicable law, the Secretary may provide funds to match gifts, devises, and bequests made for the benefit of a fa-

cility of the System. With respect to each gift,
devise, or bequest, the amount of Federal funds
may not exceed the amount (or, in the case of
property or in-kind services, the fair market
value) of the gift, devise, or bequest.

6 SEC. 4. VOLUNTEER ENHANCEMENT PILOT PROJECTS.

- 7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subject to the availability of ap-8 propriations, the Secretary of the Interior shall carry out a pilot project at 1 or more facilities of the System. Each 10 pilot project shall provide for a volunteer coordinator for the hatchery facility. The volunteer coordinator shall be responsible for recruiting, training, and supervising volun-12 teers. The volunteer coordinator may be responsible for assisting partner organizations in developing projects and 14 15 programs under cooperative agreements under section 7(d) of the Fish and Wildlife Act of 1956 (16 U.S.C. 16 742f(d)) and coordinating volunteer activities with partner organizations to carry out the projects and programs. 18
- (b) Report.—Not later than 3 years after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall a report to the Committee on Resources of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Environment and Public Works of the Senate evaluating and making recommendations regarding the pilot projects.

1	(c) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
2	authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section
3	\$150,000 for each of fiscal years 2007 through 2011.
4	SEC. 5. COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP ENHANCEMENT.
5	(a) Projects and Programs.—Subject to the re-
6	quirements of the Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act (16
7	U.S.C. 661 et seq.) and other applicable law, and such
8	terms and conditions as the Secretary of the Interior de-
9	termines to be appropriate, the Secretary may approve
10	projects and programs for a facility of the System that—
11	(1) promote the stewardship of resources of the
12	hatchery through habitat maintenance, restoration,
13	and improvement, biological monitoring, or research;
14	(2) support the operation and maintenance of
15	the hatchery through constructing, operating, main-
16	taining, or improving the facilities and services of
17	the hatchery;
18	(3) increase the awareness and understanding
19	of the hatchery and the System, through the devel-
20	opment, publication, or distribution of educational
21	materials and products;
22	(4) advance education concerning the purposes
23	of the hatchery and the mission of the System,
24	through the use of the hatchery as an outdoor class-

- 1 room and development of other educational pro-2 grams; or
- (5) contribute financial resources to the hatchery, under the terms that require that the net revenues be used exclusively for the benefit of the hatchery, through donation of net revenues from the sale
 of educational materials and products and through
 encouragement of gifts, devises, and bequests.
- 9 (b) Treasury Account.—Amounts received by the 10 Secretary of the Interior as a result of projects and pro-11 grams under subsection (a) shall be deposited in a sepa-12 rate account in the Treasury. Amounts in the account that are attributable to activities at a particular facility of the 14 System shall be available to the Secretary of the Interior, 15 without further appropriation, to pay the costs of incidental expenses related to volunteer activities, and to carry 16 17 out cooperative agreements for the hatchery facility.

18 SEC. 6. HATCHERY EDUCATION PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT.

- 19 (a) GUIDANCE.—Not later than 1 year after the date 20 of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of the Interior 21 shall develop guidance for the hatchery education programs to further the mission of the System and the purposes of individual hatcheries through—
- 24 (1) providing outdoor classroom opportunities 25 for students on fish hatcheries that combine edu-

- 1 cational curricula with the personal experiences of
- 2 students relating to fish, aquatic species, and their
- 3 habitat, and to the cultural and historical resources
- 4 of the hatcheries;
- 5 (2) promoting understanding and conservation 6 of fish, aquatic species, and the cultural and histor-
- 7 ical resources of the hatcheries; and
- 8 (3) improving scientific literacy in conjunction
- 9 with both formal and nonformal education programs.
- 10 (b) Hatchery Programs.—Based on the guidance
- 11 developed under subsection (a), the Secretary of the Inte-
- 12 rior may, with assistance from the Fish and Wildlife Man-
- 13 agement Assistance Program, develop or enhance hatchery
- 14 educational programs as appropriate, based on the re-
- 15 sources of individual hatcheries and the opportunities
- 16 available for such programs in State, local, and private
- 17 schools. In developing and implementing each program,
- 18 the Secretary should cooperate with State and local edu-
- 19 cation authorities, and may cooperate with partner organi-
- 20 zations in accordance with subsection (d).
- 21 SEC. 7. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.
- There is authorized to be appropriated to the Sec-
- 23 retary of the Interior to carry out this Act \$200,000 for
- 24 each of fiscal years 2007 through 2010.
