A BILL

To establish a volunteer program and promote community partnerships for the benefit of national fish hatcheries and fisheries program offices.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "National Fish Hatch-
3	ery System Volunteer Act of 2006".
4	SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSES.
5	(a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:
6	(1) The National Fish Hatchery System (in this
7	Act referred to as the "System")—
8	(A) consists of more than 60 hatcheries,
9	seven fish technology centers, 9 fish health cen-
10	ters, and other fisheries program offices;
11	(B) plays an integral role in the recovery
12	of more than 50 threatened species and endan-
13	gered species and the restoration of over 100
14	native species;
15	(C) provides healthy fish populations that
16	support recreational fishing opportunities, many
17	of which are related to Federal water control
18	structures; and
19	(D) works with over 250 partners to help
20	mitigate the impacts of aquatic habitat loss and
21	invasive species.
22	(2) The System faces many challenges, includ-
23	ing aging facilities, some of which date back to the
24	late 1800s, and maintenance of intensive infrastruc-
25	tures such as wells, pumps, valves, pipes, filters,
26	heaters, chillers, and treatment systems that must

- keep clean water moving 24 hours a day, 365 days
 a year.
 (3) By encouraging volunteer programs and do-
 - (3) By encouraging volunteer programs and donations and fostering non-Federal partnerships with hatchery facilities, Federal funding for the hatcheries can be supplemented.
- 7 (4) By encouraging hatchery educational pro-8 grams, public awareness of the resources of the Sys-9 tem and public participation in the conservation of 10 aquatic resources can be promoted.
- 11 (b) Purposes.—The purposes of this Act are the following:
- 13 (1) To encourage the use of volunteers to assist 14 the United States Fish and Wildlife Service in the 15 management of hatcheries within the System.
 - (2) To facilitate partnerships between the System and non-Federal entities to promote public awareness of the resources of the System and public participation in the conservation of those resources.
- (3) To encourage donations and other contribu tions by individuals and organizations to the System.
- 22 SEC. 3. GIFTS TO SYSTEM AND PARTICULAR NATIONAL
- 23 FISH HATCHERIES.
- 24 (a) AUTHORIZATION OF GIFTS, DEVISES, AND BE-25 QUESTS FOR SYSTEM.—In furtherance of the purposes of

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- this Act, the Secretary of the Interior may accept any gifts, devises, or bequests of real and personal property, 3 or proceeds therefrom, or interests therein, for the benefit 4 of the National Fish Hatchery System. Such acceptance 5 may be subject to the terms of any restrictive or affirmative covenant, or condition of servitude, if such terms are 6 7 deemed by the Secretary to be in accordance with law and 8 compatible with the purpose for which acceptance is 9 sought. 10 (b) Use of Gifts, Devises, and Bequests.— 11 (1) In General.—Any gifts and bequests of 12 money and proceeds from the sales of other property 13 received as gifts or bequests pursuant to this sub-14 section shall be deposited in a separate account in 15 the Treasury and may be expended without further 16 appropriation by the Secretary for the benefit of the 17 System programs administered by the United States 18 Fish and Wildlife Service.
 - (2) Gifts, devises, and bequests for particular facilities.—
- 21 (A) DISBURSAL.—Any gift, devise, or be-22 quest made for the benefit of a facility of the 23 System shall be disbursed only for the benefit 24 of that facility and without further appropria-25 tions.

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1 MATCHING.—Subject to the avail-(B)2 ability of appropriations and the requirements 3 of the Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act (16 4 U.S.C 661 et seq.) and other applicable law, the Secretary may provide funds to match gifts, de-6 vises, and bequests made for the benefit of a fa-7 cility of the System. With respect to each gift, 8 devise, or bequest, the amount of Federal funds 9 may not exceed the amount (or, in the case of 10 property or in-kind services, the fair market value) of the gift, devise, or bequest. 11

12 SEC. 4. VOLUNTEER ENHANCEMENT PILOT PROJECTS.

13 (a) In General.—Subject to the availability of appropriations, the Secretary of the Interior shall carry out 14 15 a pilot project at 1 or more facilities of the System. Each pilot project shall provide for a volunteer coordinator for 16 17 the hatchery facility. The volunteer coordinator shall be responsible for recruiting, training, and supervising volun-18 teers. The volunteer coordinator may be responsible for 19 20 assisting partner organizations in developing projects and 21 programs under cooperative agreements under section 22 7(d) of the Fish and Wildlife Act of 1956 (16 U.S.C. 23 742f(d)) and coordinating volunteer activities with partner organizations to carry out the projects and programs.

- 1 (b) Report.—Not later than 3 years after the date
- 2 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall a report
- 3 to the Committee on Resources of the House of Represent-
- 4 atives and the Committee on Environment and Public
- 5 Works of the Senate evaluating and making recommenda-
- 6 tions regarding the pilot projects.
- 7 (c) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
- 8 authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section
- 9 \$150,000 for each of fiscal years 2007 through 2011.

10 SEC. 5. COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP ENHANCEMENT.

- 11 (a) Projects and Programs.—Subject to the re-
- 12 quirements of the Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act (16
- 13 U.S.C. 661 et seq.) and other applicable law, and such
- 14 terms and conditions as the Secretary of the Interior de-
- 15 termines to be appropriate, the Secretary may approve
- 16 projects and programs for a facility of the System that—
- 17 (1) promote the stewardship of resources of the
- 18 hatchery through habitat maintenance, restoration,
- and improvement, biological monitoring, or research;
- 20 (2) support the operation and maintenance of
- 21 the hatchery through constructing, operating, main-
- taining, or improving the facilities and services of
- 23 the hatchery;
- 24 (3) increase the awareness and understanding
- of the hatchery and the System, through the devel-

- opment, publication, or distribution of educational materials and products;
- (4) advance education concerning the purposes
 of the hatchery and the mission of the System,
 through the use of the hatchery as an outdoor classroom and development of other educational programs; or
- (5) contribute financial resources to the hatchery, under the terms that require that the net revenues be used exclusively for the benefit of the hatchery, through donation of net revenues from the sale
 of educational materials and products and through
 encouragement of gifts, devises, and bequests.
- 14 (b) Treasury Account.—Amounts received by the 15 Secretary of the Interior as a result of projects and programs under subsection (a) shall be deposited in a sepa-16 17 rate account in the Treasury. Amounts in the account that 18 are attributable to activities at a particular facility of the 19 System shall be available to the Secretary of the Interior, without further appropriation, to pay the costs of inci-21 dental expenses related to volunteer activities, and to carry 22 out cooperative agreements for the hatchery facility.

23 SEC. 6. HATCHERY EDUCATION PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT.

24 (a) Guidance.—Not later than 1 year after the date 25 of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of the Interior

- 1 shall develop guidance for the hatchery education pro-
- 2 grams to further the mission of the System and the pur-
- 3 poses of individual hatcheries through—
- 4 (1) providing outdoor classroom opportunities
- 5 for students on fish hatcheries that combine edu-
- 6 cational curricula with the personal experiences of
- 7 students relating to fish, aquatic species, and their
- 8 habitat, and to the cultural and historical resources
- 9 of the hatcheries;
- 10 (2) promoting understanding and conservation
- of fish, aquatic species, and the cultural and histor-
- ical resources of the hatcheries; and
- 13 (3) improving scientific literacy in conjunction
- with both formal and nonformal education programs.
- 15 (b) HATCHERY PROGRAMS.—Based on the guidance
- 16 developed under subsection (a), the Secretary of the Inte-
- 17 rior may, with assistance from the Fish and Wildlife Man-
- 18 agement Assistance Program, develop or enhance hatchery
- 19 educational programs as appropriate, based on the re-
- 20 sources of individual hatcheries and the opportunities
- 21 available for such programs in State, local, and private
- 22 schools. In developing and implementing each program,
- 23 the Secretary should cooperate with State and local edu-
- 24 cation authorities, and may cooperate with partner organi-
- 25 zations in accordance with subsection (d).

1 SEC. 7. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

- 2 There is authorized to be appropriated to the Sec-
- 3 retary of the Interior to carry out this Act \$200,000 for
- 4 each of fiscal years 2007 through 2010.

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
