1SEC. 2. SECRETARY OF EDUCATION TO SUPPORT MERIT-2BASED TEACHER COMPENSATION SYSTEMS3THAT ARE BASED PRIMARILY OR EXCLU-4SIVELY ON STUDENT LEARNING GAINS OR5MAINTENANCE OF STUDENT LEARNING6GAINS, OR BOTH.

7 In making awards to support merit-based teacher compensation systems, under the Teacher Incentive Fund 8 9 or any other grant program to support merit-based teacher compensation systems using funds available pursuant 10 to subpart 1 of part D of title V of the Elementary and 11 Secondary Education Act of 1965, the Secretary of Edu-12 cation shall ensure that, for each fiscal year, all of the 13 14 funds so awarded are awarded to support merit-based compensation systems that are based primarily (at least 15 50 percent) or exclusively on student learning gains or 16 maintenance of student learning gains, or both. 17

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
