A BILL

To amend the Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002 to authorize the Secretary of Agriculture to consider variations in the national average market price for different classes of wheat when determining the eligibility of wheat producers for counter-cyclical payments for the 2005, 2006, and 2007 crop years.

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Wheat Counter-Cycli-
- 5 cal Payments Enhancement Act of 2006".

1	SEC. 2. USE OF FLEXIBLE EFFECTIVE PRICES FOR DIF-
2	FERENT CLASSES OF WHEAT TO DETERMINE
3	ELIGIBILITY OF WHEAT PRODUCERS FOR
4	COUNTER-CYCLICAL PAYMENTS.
5	Section 1104 of the Farm Security and Rural Invest-
6	ment Act of 2002 (7 U.S.C. 7914) is amended—
7	(1) in subsection (b), by inserting "and subject
8	to subsection (g)," after "subsection (a),"; and
9	(2) by adding at the end the following new sub-
10	section:
11	"(g) Special Effective Prices for Classes of
12	WHEAT.—
13	"(1) Separate effective prices author-
14	IZED.—For purposes of the 2005, 2006, and 2007
15	crop years of wheat, the Secretary shall calculate a
16	separate effective price for one or more classes of
17	wheat in recognition of the wide variations in aver-
18	age market prices for different classes of wheat,
19	which when combined under subsection (b) to deter-
20	mine a single national average market price for
21	wheat has deprived producers of those classes of
22	wheat whose price is declining, including soft white
23	wheat, of needed counter-cyclical payments.
24	"(2) CALCULATION.—For purposes of sub-
25	section (a), when the Secretary calculates a separate
26	effective price for a class of wheat under this sub-

1	section instead of subsection (b), the effective price
2	for that class of wheat shall be equal to the sum
3	of—
4	"(A) the higher of—
5	"(i) the national average market price
6	received by producers during the 12-month
7	marketing year for that class of wheat, as
8	determined by the Secretary; or
9	"(ii) the national average loan rate for
10	that class of wheat during that period, as
11	determined by the Secretary; and
12	"(B) the payment rate in effect for wheat
13	under section 1103 for the purpose of making
14	direct payments with respect to wheat.".

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
