## A BILL

To provide that no Federal funds may be used for the design, renovation, construction, or rental of any head-quarters for the United Nations in any location in the United States unless the President transmits to Congress a certification that the United Nations has adopted internationally-recognized best practices in contracting and procurement.

1	SECTION 1. PROHIBITION OF FEDERAL FUNDS FOR THE
2	DESIGN, RENOVATION, CONSTRUCTION, OR
3	RENTAL OF ANY HEADQUARTERS FOR THE
4	UNITED NATIONS IN ANY LOCATION IN THE
5	UNITED STATES.
6	(a) Prohibition.—No Federal funds may be used
7	for the design, renovation, construction, or rental of any
8	headquarters for the United Nations in any location in
9	the United States.
10	(b) Exception.—Subsection (a) shall cease to be ef-
11	fective if the President transmits to Congress a certifi-
12	cation that the United Nations has adopted internation-
13	ally-recognized best practices in contracting and procure-
14	ment.
