A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to provide for enhanced protection of sensitive personal information processed or maintained by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Stop Endangering the
- 5 Records of Veterans (SERVE) Act of 2006".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 Congress finds as follows:

- 1 (1) Identity theft remains a critical problem for 2 consumers. In May 2006, the Federal Trade Com-3 mission revealed that 10,000,000 individuals are 4 subjected to theft of their personal identification li-5 censes and records each year.
 - (2) Recent thefts of computer hardware containing sensitive personal information from the Department of Veterans Affairs and its contractors have made millions of veterans vulnerable to identity theft and fraud.
 - (3) On May 22, 2006, the Department of Veterans Affairs announced an employee laptop containing personal records of nearly 26,500,000 million veterans and spouses had been stolen.
 - (4) On August 7, 2006, a desktop computer containing personal information of more than 38,000 veterans was stolen from a subcontractor hired to assist in insurance collections for medical centers of the Department of Veterans Affairs in Pittsburgh and Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.
 - (5) In August 2006, in response to the loss of these records, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs created the office of Special Advisor to the Secretary for Information Security.

1	(6) On August 14, 2006, the Secretary an-
2	nounced the award of a \$3,700,000 contract to a
3	service-disabled, veteran-owned small business to up-
4	grade all Department computers with enhanced data
5	security encryption systems.
6	(7) In order to prevent the Nation's veterans
7	from being exposed to identity theft and fraud, addi-
8	tional Federal safeguards, including those provided
9	by this Act, must be applied to increase account-
10	ability of those who handle veterans' records in
11	order to prevent future losses of sensitive personal
12	information.

Contracts for the processing or maintenance 2 of sensitive personal information "(a) Contract Requirements.—If the Secretary 3 enters into a contract for the performance of any Depart-4 5 ment function that requires access to sensitive personal information, the Secretary shall require as a condition of 6 7 the contract that— 8 "(1) the contractor ensures that it will— 9 "(A) encrypt or encode any such informa-10 tion to which the contractor has access; and "(B) physically secure all such information 11 12 that it processes or maintains and all equip-13 ment containing such information; and 14 "(2) the contractor agrees to reimburse the 15 Secretary for any amount paid by the Secretary to 16 any person as a result of the contractor's unauthor-17 ized disclosure of any sensitive personal information 18 to which the contractor has access under the con-19 tract. 20 "(b) Penalty for Violations.—Any contractor who violates any requirement of this subtitle shall be 21 22 debarred from contracting with the Department for a period of one year. 23

- Not later than 180 days after the date of the enact-
