Requesting the President to provide to the House of Representatives certain documents in his possession relating to United States policy toward Iran.

Mr. KUCINICH (for himself, Mr. PAUL, Mr. ABERCROMBIE, Ms. LEE, Ms. WOOLSEY, Mr. DEFazio, Mr. HINCHEY, Mr. STARK, Mr. FILNER, Mr. DAVIS of Illinois, Ms. WATSON, Mr. HASTINGS of Florida, Ms. MOORE of Wisconsin, Mr. UDALL of New Mexico, Mr. FARR, and Mr. GRIJALVA) submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Armed Services, and in addition to the Committees on International Relations and Select Intelligence (Permanent Select), for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

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## RESOLUTION

Requesting the President to provide to the House of Representatives certain documents in his possession relating to United States policy toward Iran.

- 1       *Resolved*, That the President is requested to provide
- 2 to the House of Representatives, not later than 14 days
- 3 after the date of the adoption of this resolution, all docu-
- 4 ments in the possession of the President relating to—

1           (1) the intelligence on Iran's nuclear energy  
2           program and Iran's capability to threaten the  
3           United States with nuclear weapons;

4           (2) any decision to remove the ruling regime  
5           from power in Iran, by means of United States mili-  
6           tary strikes, internal or external dissident groups  
7           and individuals, and by any other means;

8           (3) covert action (as defined in section 503 of  
9           the National Security Act of 1947 (50 U.S.C.  
10          413b)) being conducted by any United States Armed  
11          Forces in Iran, and training by United States  
12          Armed Forces of any group or organization for the  
13          conduct of operations hostile to the current regime  
14          of Iran, including the Mojahedin-e Khalq (MEK)  
15          and any individuals ever associated with MEK, and  
16          the Iranian Party of Free Life in Kurdistan (PJAK)  
17          and any individuals ever associated with PJAK;

18          (4) creation of a new office in the Department  
19          of Defense similar in scope, function, or mandate to  
20          the former Office of Special Plans;

21          (5) "Prepare to Deploy" orders by the United  
22          States Navy to the waters near Iran; and

23          (6) all National Intelligence Estimates or any  
24          other intelligence community analysis regarding the  
25          consequences of attacking Iran, including the likeli-

1        hood of increased prices of gasoline and oil and the  
2        economic impact to the United States of such in-  
3        creased gasoline and oil prices, the likelihood of in-  
4        creased attacks on United States troops in Iraq, and  
5        the growth of anti-American sentiment in the Is-  
6        lamic world.

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
