Mr. PUTNAM, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 95) establishing the congressional budget for the United States Government for fiscal year 2006, revising appropriate budgetary levels for fiscal year 2005, and setting forth appropriate budgetary levels for fiscal years 2007 through 2010.

- 1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
- 2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
- 3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee

1 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
2 ation of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 95) estab-
3 lishing the congressional budget for the United States
4 Government for fiscal year 2006, revising appropriate
5 budgetary levels for fiscal year 2005, and setting forth ap-
6 propriate budgetary levels for fiscal years 2007 through
7 2010. The first reading of the concurrent resolution shall
8 be dispensed with. All points of order against consider-
9 ation of the concurrent resolution are waived. General de-
10 bate shall not exceed five hours, with four hours of general
11 debate confined to the congressional budget equally di-
12 vided and controlled by the chairman and ranking minor-
13 ity member of the Committee on the Budget and one hour
14 of general debate on the subject of economic goals and
15 policies equally divided and controlled by Representative
16 Saxton of New Jersey and Representative Maloney of New
17 York or their designees. After general debate the concur-
18 rent resolution shall be considered for amendment under
19 the five-minute rule. The concurrent resolution shall be
20 considered as read. No amendment shall be in order except
21 those printed in the report of the Committee on Rules ac-
22 companying this resolution. Each amendment may be of-
23 fered only in the order printed in the report, may be of-
24 fered only by a Member designated in the report, shall
25 be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time spec-

1 ified in the report equally divided and controlled by an
2 opponent and a proponent, shall not be subject to amend-
3 ment, and shall not be subject to a demand for division
4 of the question in the House and in the Committee of the
5 Whole. All points of order against such amendments are
6 waived except that the adoption of an amendment in the
7 nature of a substitute shall constitute the conclusion of
8 consideration of the concurrent resolution for amendment.
9 After the conclusion of consideration of the concurrent
10 resolution for amendment, the Committee shall rise and
11 report the concurrent resolution to the House with such
12 amendments as may have been adopted. The previous
13 question shall be considered as ordered on the concurrent
14 resolution and amendments thereto to final adoption with-
15 out intervening motion except amendments offered by the
16 chairman of the Committee on the Budget pursuant to
17 section 305(a)(5) of the Congressional Budget Act of
18 1974 to achieve mathematical consistency. The concurrent
19 resolution shall not be subject to a demand for division
20 of the question of its adoption.

21 SEC. 2. After adoption of House Concurrent Resolu-
22 tion 95, it shall be in order to take from the Speaker's
23 table Senate Concurrent Resolution 18 and to consider the
24 Senate concurrent resolution in the House. All points of
25 order against the Senate concurrent resolution and

1 against its consideration are waived. It shall be in order
2 to move to strike all after the resolving clause of the Sen-
3 ate concurrent resolution and to insert in lieu thereof the
4 provisions of House Concurrent Resolution 95 as adopted
5 by the House. All points of order against that motion are
6 waived.
