Mr. GINGREY, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3199) to extend and modify authorities needed to combat terrorism, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 3199) to extend and modify authori-
6 ties needed to combat terrorism, and for other purposes.
7 The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. All

1 points of order against consideration of the bill are waived.
2 General debate shall be confined to the bill and the amend-
3 ments made in order by this resolution and shall not ex-
4 ceed two hours, with one hour and 30 minutes equally di-
5 vided and controlled by the chairman and ranking minor-
6 ity member of the Committee on the Judiciary and 30
7 minutes equally divided and controlled by the chairman
8 and ranking minority member of the Permanent Select
9 Committee on Intelligence. After general debate the bill
10 shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute
11 rule. In lieu of the amendments recommended by the Com-
12 mittee on the Judiciary and the Permanent Select Com-
13 mittee on Intelligence now printed in the bill, it shall be
14 in order to consider as an original bill for the purpose of
15 amendment under the five-minute rule the amendment in
16 the nature of a substitute printed in part A of the report
17 of the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution.
18 That amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be
19 considered as read. All points of order against that amend-
20 ment in the nature of a substitute are waived. Notwith-
21 standing clause 11 of rule XVIII, no amendment to that
22 amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be in order
23 except those printed in part B of the report of the Com-
24 mittee on Rules. Each amendment may be offered only
25 in the order printed in the report, may be offered only

1 by a Member designated in the report, shall be considered
2 as read, shall be debatable for the time specified in the
3 report equally divided and controlled by the proponent and
4 an opponent, shall not be subject to amendment, and shall
5 not be subject to a demand for division of the question
6 in the House or in the Committee of the Whole. All points
7 of order against such amendments are waived. At the con-
8 clusion of consideration of the bill for amendment the
9 Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House with
10 such amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member
11 may demand a separate vote in the House on any amend-
12 ment adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill
13 or to the amendment in the nature of a substitute made
14 in order as original text. The previous question shall be
15 considered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto
16 to final passage without intervening motion except one
17 motion to recommit with or without instructions.
