Mrs. CAPITO, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 889) to authorize appropriations for the Coast Guard for fiscal year 2006, to make technical corrections to various laws administered by the Coast Guard, and for other purposes and providing for consideration of motions to suspend the rules.

Resolved, That at any time after the adoption of this
 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-

ation of the bill (H.R. 889) to authorize appropriations 1 2 for the Coast Guard for fiscal year 2006, to make tech-3 nical corrections to various laws administered by the Coast 4 Guard, and for other purposes. The first reading of the 5 bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order against consideration of the bill are waived. General debate shall 6 7 be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equal-8 ly divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking mi-9 nority member of the Committee on Transportation and 10 Infrastructure. After general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute rule. It shall 11 be in order to consider as an original bill for the purpose 12 13 of amendment under the five-minute rule the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Com-14 15 mittee on Transportation and Infrastructure now printed in the bill. The committee amendment in the nature of 16 17 a substitute shall be considered by title rather than by 18 section. Each title shall be considered as read. All points 19 of order against the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute are waived. Notwithstanding clause 11 of 20 21 rule XVIII, no amendment to the committee amendment 22 in the nature of a substitute shall be in order except those 23 printed in the portion of the Congressional Record des-24 ignated for that purpose in clause 8 of rule XVIII and 25 except pro forma amendments for the purpose of debate.

Each amendment so printed may be offered only by the 1 2 Member who caused it to be printed or his designee and shall be considered as read. At the conclusion of consider-3 4 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise 5 and report the bill to the House with such amendments 6 as may have been adopted. Any Member may demand a 7 separate vote in the House on any amendment adopted 8 in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to the com-9 mittee amendment in the nature of a substitute. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the bill 10 and amendments thereto to final passage without inter-11 12 vening motion except one motion to recommit with or 13 without instructions.

SEC. 2. It shall be in order at any time on the legislative day of Thursday, September 15, 2005, for the Speaker to entertain a motion that the House suspend the rules
relating to the bill H.R. 3768.

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
