A BILL

- To amend the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act to designate portions of the Musconetcong River in the State of New Jersey as a component of the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Musconetcong Wild3 and Scenic Rivers Act".

4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

5 Congress finds that—

6 (1) the Secretary of the Interior, in cooperation 7 and consultation with appropriate Federal, State, re-8 gional, and local agencies, is conducting a study of 9 the eligibility and suitability of the Musconetcong 10 River in the State of New Jersey for inclusion in the 11 Wild and Scenic Rivers System;

12 (2) the Musconetcong Wild and Scenic River 13 Study Task Force, with assistance from the Na-14 tional Park Service, has prepared a river manage-15 ment plan for the study area entitled "Musconetcong" 16 River Management Plan" and dated April 2002 that 17 establishes goals and actions to ensure long-term 18 protection of the outstanding values of the river and 19 compatible management of land and water resources 20 associated with the Musconetcong River; and

(3) 13 municipalities and 3 counties along segments of the Musconetcong River that are eligible
for designation have passed resolutions in which the
municipalities and counties—

25 (A) express support for the Musconetcong
26 River Management Plan;

1	(B) agree to take action to implement the
2	goals of the management plan; and
3	(C) endorse designation of the
4	Musconetcong River as a component of the
5	Wild and Scenic Rivers System.
6	SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.

7 In this Act:

8 (1) ADDITIONAL RIVER SEGMENT.—The term 9 "additional river segment" means the approximately 10 4.3-mile Musconetcong River segment designated as 11 "C" in the management plan, from Hughesville Mill 12 to the Delaware River Confluence.

(2) MANAGEMENT PLAN.—The term "manage-13 14 ment plan" means the river management plan pre-15 pared by the Musconetcong River Management Com-16 mittee, the National Park Service, the Heritage Con-17 servancy, and the Musconetcong Watershed Associa-18 tion entitled "Musconetcong River Management 19 Plan" and dated April 2002 that establishes goals 20 and actions to-

21 (A) ensure long-term protection of the out22 standing values of the river segments; and

(B) compatible management of land and
water resources associated with the river segments.

1	(3) RIVER SEGMENT.—The term "river seg-
2	ment" means any segment of the Musconetcong
3	River, New Jersey, designated as a scenic river or
4	recreational river by section $3(a)(167)$ of the Wild
5	and Scenic Rivers Act (as added by section 4).
6	(4) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
7	the Secretary of the Interior.
8	SEC. 4. DESIGNATION OF PORTIONS OF MUSCONETCONG
9	RIVER, NEW JERSEY, AS SCENIC AND REC-
10	REATIONAL RIVERS.
11	Section $3(a)$ of the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act (16
12	U.S.C. 1274(a)) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
13	lowing:

"(B) ADMINISTRATION.—Notwithstanding sec tion 10(c), the river segments designated under sub paragraph (A) shall not be administered as part of
 the National Park System.".

5 SEC. 5. MANAGEMENT.

6 (a) MANAGEMENT PLAN.—

7 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall manage
8 the river segments in accordance with the manage9 ment plan.

10 (2) SATISFACTION OF REQUIREMENTS FOR
11 PLAN.—The management plan shall be considered to
12 satisfy the requirements for a comprehensive man13 agement plan for the river segments under section
14 3(d) of the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act (16 U.S.C.
15 1274(d)).

16 (3)RESTRICTIONS ON WATER RESOURCE 17 PROJECTS.—For purposes of determining whether a 18 proposed water resources project would have a direct 19 and adverse effect on the values for which a river 20 segment is designated as part of the Wild and Sce-21 nic Rivers System under section 7(a) of the Wild 22 and Scenic Rivers Act (16 U.S.C. 1278(a)), the Sec-23 retary shall consider the extent to which the pro-24 posed water resources project is consistent with the 25 management plan.

1	(4) IMPLEMENTATION.—The Secretary may
2	provide technical assistance, staff support, and fund-
3	ing to assist in the implementation of the manage-
4	ment plan.
5	(b) COOPERATION.—
6	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall manage
7	the river segments in cooperation with appropriate
8	Federal, State, regional, and local agencies, includ-

3	(c) Land Management.—
4	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may provide
5	planning, financial, and technical assistance to local
6	municipalities and nonprofit organizations to assist
7	in the implementation of actions to protect the nat-
8	ural and historic resources of the river segments.
9	(2) PLAN REQUIREMENTS.—After adoption of
10	recommendations made in section IV of the manage-
11	ment plan, the zoning ordinances of the municipali-
12	ties bordering the segments shall be considered to
13	satisfy the standards and requirements under sec-
14	tion $6(c)$ of the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act (16
15	U.S.C. 1277(c)).
16	(d) Designation of Additional River Seg-
17	MENT.—
18	(1) FINDING.—Congress finds that the addi-
19	tional river segment is suitable for designation as a
20	recreational river if the Secretary determines that
21	there is adequate local support for the designation of
22	the additional river segment in accordance with
23	paragraph (3).
24	(2) Designation and administration.—If

25 the Secretary determines that there is adequate local

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1	support for designating the additional river segment
2	as a recreational river—
3	(A) the Secretary shall publish in the Fed-
4	eral Register notice of the designation of the
5	segment;
6	(B) the segment shall be designated as a
7	recreational river in accordance with the Wild
8	and Scenic Rivers Act (16 U.S.C. 1271 et seq.);
9	and
10	(C) the Secretary shall administer the ad-
11	ditional river segment as a recreational river.
12	(3) CRITERIA FOR LOCAL SUPPORT.—In deter-
13	mining whether there is adequate local support for
14	the designation of the additional river segment, the
15	Secretary shall consider the preferences of local gov-
16	ernments expressed in resolutions concerning des-
17	ignation of the additional river segment.
18	(e) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
19	are authorized to be appropriated such sums as are nec-
20	essary to carry out this Act and the amendments made
21	by this Act.
