A BILL

To treat the Tuesday next after the first Monday in November as a legal public holiday for purposes of Federal employment, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Democracy Day Act
- 5 of 2005".
- 6 SEC. 2. TREATMENT OF ELECTION DAY IN SAME MANNER
- 7 AS OTHER FEDERAL HOLIDAYS.
- 8 The Tuesday next after the first Monday in Novem-
- 9 ber in 2006 and in each even-numbered year thereafter

- 1 shall be treated as a legal public holiday for purposes of
- 2 statutes relating to pay and leave of Federal employees.
- 3 SEC. 3. STUDY BY COMPTROLLER GENERAL OF IMPACT ON
- 4 **VOTER PARTICIPATION.**
- 5 (a) In General.—The Comptroller General shall
- 6 conduct a study of the impact of section 2 on voter partici-
- 7 pation.
- 8 (b) Report.—Not later than May 1, 2010, the
- 9 Comptroller General shall submit a report to Congress and
- 10 the President on the results of the study conducted under
- 11 subsection (a).
- 12 SEC. 4. SENSE OF CONGRESS REGARDING TREATMENT OF
- 13 DAY BY PRIVATE EMPLOYERS.
- 14 It is the sense of Congress that private employers in
- 15 the United States should provide their employees with
- 16 flexibility on the Tuesday next after the first Monday in
- 17 November in 2006 and in each even-numbered year there-
- 18 after to enable the employees to cast votes in the elections
- 19 held on that day.
