A BILL

To appropriate \$1,975,183,000 for medical care for veterans.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 That the following sum is appropriated, out of any money4 in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the De-5 partment of Veterans Affairs for the fiscal year ending

6 September 30, 2005, namely:

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7 DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS

8 VETERANS HEALTH ADMINISTRATION

Medical Services

For necessary expenses for furnishing, as authorized
by law, outpatient and inpatient care and treatment to
beneficiaries of the Department of Veterans Affairs and

1 veterans as described in paragraphs (1) through (8) of 2 section 1705(a) of title 38, United States Code, including 3 care and treatment in facilities not under the jurisdiction 4 of the department and including medical supplies and 5 equipment and salaries and expenses of health-care employees hired under title 38, United States Code, and to 6 7 aid State homes as authorized under section 1741 of title 8 38, United States Code; \$1,975,183,000 plus reimburse-9 ments: *Provided*, That of the amount under this heading, 10 \$610,183,000 shall be available to address the needs of servicemembers deployed for Operation Iraqi Freedom and 11 12 Operation Enduring Freedom; *Provided further*, That of 13 the amount under this heading, \$840,000,000 shall be 14 available, in equal amounts of \$40,000,000, for each Vet-15 erans Integrated Service Network (VISN) to meet current and pending care and treatment requirements: Provided 16 17 *further*, That of the amount under this heading, 18 \$525,000,000 shall be available for mental health care and treatment, including increased funding for centers for the 19 20 provision of readjustment counseling and related mental 21 health services under section 1712A of title 38, United 22 States Code (commonly referred to as "Vet Centers"), in-23 creased funding for post traumatic stress disorder 24 (PTSD) programs, funding for the provision of primary 25 care consultations for mental health, funding for the provision of mental health counseling in Community Based
 Outreach Centers (CBOCs), and funding to facilitate the
 provision of mental health services by Department of Vet erans Affairs facilities that do not currently provide such
 services: *Provided further*, That the amount under this
 heading shall remain available until expended.
