Mr. McCAIN introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Indian Affairs

A BILL

To amend the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act to provide for accountability and funding of the National Indian Gaming Commission.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “National Indian Gam-
5 ing Commission Accountability Act of 2005”.

6 **SEC. 2. COMMISSION ACCOUNTABILITY AND FUNDING.**

7 (a) POWERS OF THE COMMISSION.—Section 7 of the
8 Indian Gaming Regulatory Act (25 U.S.C. 2706) is
9 amended by adding at the end the following:

1 “(d) APPLICATION OF GOVERNMENT PERFORMANCE
2 AND RESULTS ACT.—

3 “(1) IN GENERAL.—In carrying out any action
4 under this Act, the Commission shall be subject to
5 the Government Performance and Results Act of
6 1993 (Public Law 103–62; 107 Stat. 285).

7 “(2) PLANS.—In addition to any plan required
8 under the Government Performance and Results Act
9 of 1993 (Public Law 103–62; 107 Stat. 285), the
10 Commission shall submit a plan to provide technical
11 assistance to tribal gaming operations in accordance
12 with that Act.”.

13 (b) COMMISSION FUNDING.—Section 18(a)(2) of the
14 Indian Gaming Regulatory Act (25 U.S.C. 2717(a)(2)) is
15 amended by striking subparagraph (B) and inserting the
16 following:

17 “(B) The total amount of all fees imposed
18 during any fiscal year under the schedule estab-
19 lished under paragraph (1) shall not exceed
20 0.080 percent of the gross gaming revenues of
21 all gaming operations subject to regulation
22 under this Act.”.
