AN ACT

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study of maritime sites in the State of Michigan.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Michigan Lighthouse5 and Maritime Heritage Act".

1 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.

2 In this Act:

3 (1) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means
4 the Secretary of the Interior.

5 (2) STATE.—The term "State" means the State6 of Michigan.

7 SEC. 3. STUDY.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary, in consultation 9 with the State, the State Historic Preservation Officer, 10 and other appropriate State and local public agencies and 11 private organizations, shall conduct a special resource 12 study of resources related to the maritime heritage of the 13 State.

14 (b) PURPOSE.—The purpose of the study is to deter-15 mine—

16 (1) suitable and feasible options for the long17 term protection of significant maritime heritage re18 sources in the State; and

(2) the manner in which the public can bestlearn about and experience the resources.

21 (c) REQUIREMENTS.—In conducting the study under
22 subsection (a), the Secretary shall—

(1) review Federal, State, and local maritime
resource inventories and studies to establish the potential for interpretation and preservation of maritime heritage resources in the State;

(2) recommend management alternatives that
 would be most effective for long-term resource pro tection and providing for public enjoyment of mari time heritage resources;

5 (3) address how to assist regional, State, and
6 local partners in increasing public awareness of and
7 access to maritime heritage resources;

8 (4) identify sources of financial and technical 9 assistance available to communities for the preserva-10 tion and interpretation of maritime heritage re-11 sources; and

(5) identify opportunities for the National Park
Service and the State to coordinate the activities of
appropriate units of national, State, and local parks
and historic sites in furthering the preservation and
interpretation of maritime heritage resources.

(d) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date
on which funds are made available to carry out the study
under subsection (a), the Secretary shall submit to the
Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate and the Committee on Resources of the House of Representatives a report that describes—

23 (1) the results of the study; and

24 (2) any findings and recommendations of the25 Secretary.

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1 SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

- 2 There are authorized to be appropriated such sums
- 3 as are necessary to carry out this Act.
