1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "United States Parole
5 Commission Extension and Sentencing Commission Au6 thority Act of 2005".

7 SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF EXISTENCE OF THE PAROLE COM8 MISSION.

9 For purposes of section 235(b) of the Sentencing Re10 form Act of 1984 (98 Stat. 2032) as such section relates
11 to chapter 311 of title 18, United States Code, and the

United States Parole Commission, each reference in such
 section to "eighteen years" or "eighteen-year period" shall
 be deemed a reference to "21 years" or "21-year period",
 respectively.

5 SEC. 3. PROVISION OF EMERGENCY AMENDMENT AUTHOR6 ITY FOR SENTENCING COMMISSION.

7 In accordance with the procedure set forth in section
8 21(a) of the Sentencing Act of 1987 (Public Law 100–
9 182), as though the authority under that Act had not ex10 pired, the United States Sentencing Commission shall—

(1) not later than 60 days after the date of the
enactment of this Act, amend the Federal sentencing
guidelines, commentary, and policy statements to
implement section 6703 of the Intelligence Reform
and Terrorism Prevention Act of 2004 (Public Law
108–458); and

18 the enactment of this Act, amend the Federal sen19 tencing guidelines, commentary, and policy state20 ments to implement section 3 of the Anabolic Ster21 oid Control Act of 2004 (Public Law 108–358).
