A BILL

 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Affordable Books for5 College Act".

3 Title VII of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20
4 U.S.C. 1133 et seq.) is amended by adding at the end
5 the following:

6 "PART E—COLLEGE BOOKSTORE RENTAL 7 EXPANSION PROGRAM

8 "SEC. 771. LOANS AUTHORIZED.

9 "(a) IN GENERAL.—

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10 "(1) AUTHORIZATION.—From the amounts ap-11 propriated pursuant to subsection (h), the Secretary 12 shall make loans on a competitive basis to not more 13 than 50 eligible entities to support programs that 14 expand the services of bookstores to provide the op-15 tion for students to rent course materials in order 16 to achieve savings for students.

17 "(2) GRANT PROGRAM.—The Secretary shall 18 award grants to eligible entities to enable such enti-19 ties to conduct, prior to submitting an application 20 under subsection (c), a feasibility study to determine 21 whether a program described in paragraph (1) would 22 be effective at the school served by the entity. The 23 maximum amount of a grant made pursuant to this 24 subsection shall be \$25,000.

25 "(3) MODELS FOR BEST PRACTICES.—Not less
26 often than once every 2 years, the Secretary shall
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compile and make publicly available a document that
 contains potential models and best practices for the
 use of entities carrying out college textbook rental
 programs.

5 "(b) Allocation of Funds.—

6 "(1) PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD.—In promul-7 gating regulations to carry out the provision relating 8 to the application procedures under subsection (c), 9 the Secretary shall provide for a public comment pe-10 riod for outside groups to review and comment on 11 such procedures before they are finalized by the Sec-12 retary.

13 (2)AMOUNT.—The MAXIMUM maximum 14 amount of a loan made pursuant to this section shall 15 be \$2,500,000. The maximum amount for all loans 16 made pursuant to this section shall be \$50,000,000. 17 "(c) APPLICATION.—An eligible entity that desires to 18 obtain a loan under this part shall submit an application to the Secretary at such time, in such form, and con-19 20 taining or accompanied by such information, agreements, 21 and assurances as the Secretary may reasonably require. 22 "(d) USE OF FUNDS.—The funds made available by

23 a loan under this part may be used for—

24 "(1) purchase of course materials that the enti-25 ty will make available by rent to students;

1	((2) any agginment on software pagessony for
	"(2) any equipment or software necessary for
2	the conduct of a rental program;
3	"(3) hiring staff needed for the conduct of a
4	rental program, with priority given to hiring enrolled
5	undergraduate students; and
6	"(4) building or acquiring extra storage space
7	dedicated to course materials for rent.
8	"(e) Amount and Terms of Loans.—The Sec-
9	retary shall prescribe the terms and conditions of the loans
10	under this part, except that the interest rate shall be equal
11	to the rate applicable to funds borrowed by the Secretary
12	from the Treasury to carry out the demonstration pro-
13	gram under this part.
14	"(f) ELIGIBLE ENTITY.—To be eligible to receive a
15	loan under this section, an entity shall be—
16	((1)(A) an institution of higher education; or
17	"(B) a campus or local nonprofit or for-profit
18	bookstore, a bookstore cooperative, or an auxiliary
19	service unit; and
20	((2)) if the entity is an entity described in para-
21	graph (1)(B), recognized by an institution of higher
22	education as effectively delivering course materials
23	to undergraduate college students.
24	"(g) Study.—Not later than September 30, 2010,
25	the Secretary shall conduct a study on the savings

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achieved by students who participate in college textbook
 rental programs.

3 "(h) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There 4 are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this part 5 such sums as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006 and 6 each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years.".

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
