A BILL

To require the Secretary of the Interior to provide incidental take permits to public electric utilities that adopt avian protection plans.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. INCIDENTAL TAKE PERMITS FOR PUBLIC ELEC-

4 TRIC UTILITIES WITH AVIAN PROTECTION 5 PLANS.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding the Act of June
8, 1940 (16 U.S.C. 668 et seq.) (commonly known as the
"Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act") and the Migratory Bird Treaty Act (16 U.S.C. 703 et seq.), the Sec-

retary of the Interior shall provide an incidental take per mit to a public electric utility that has adopted an avian
 protection plan, if the Secretary determines that the public
 utility has included in the plan specific measures to miti gate hazards to eagles and other migratory birds.

6 (b) PENALTIES.—Any public utility that receives an 7 incidental take permit under this section (including an officer, director, or employee of the public utility) shall not 8 9 be subject to criminal or civil penalty under an Act referred to in subsection (a) for the incidental death by elec-10 11 trocution of a bird described in subsection (a)(1) by a 12 power line of the public utility during the period the per-13 mit is in effect.
