Mr. Santorum introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions

A BILL

To establish a Congressional Commission on Expanding Social Service Delivery Options.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Congressional Commis-
- 5 sion on Expanding Social Service Delivery Options Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMISSION.
- 7 (a) Establishment.—There is established a Con-
- 8 gressional Commission on Expanding Social Service Deliv-
- 9 ery Options (referred to in this Act as the "Commission").
- 10 (b) Membership.—

1	(1) Composition.—The Commission shall be
2	composed of 10 members, of whom—
3	(A) 3 shall be appointed by the Speaker of
4	the House of Representatives;
5	(B) 3 shall be appointed by the majority
6	leader of the Senate;
7	(C) 2 shall be appointed by the minority
8	leader of the House of Representatives; and
9	(D) 2 shall be appointed by the minority
10	leader of the Senate.
11	(2) QUALIFICATIONS.—Members of the Com-
12	mission shall be appointed from among individuals
13	with demonstrated expertise and experience in social
14	service delivery, including, to the extent practicable,
15	in the area of reform of such delivery.
16	(3) Date.—The appointments of the members
17	of the Commission shall be made not later than 30
18	days after the date of enactment of this Act.
19	(c) Period of Appointment; Vacancies.—Mem-
20	bers shall be appointed for the life of the Commission. Any
21	vacancy in the Commission shall not affect its powers, but
22	shall be filled in the same manner as the original appoint-
23	ment.
24	(d) Co-Chairpersons.—The Speaker of the House
25	of Representatives shall designate 1 of the members ap-

- 1 pointed under subsection (b)(1)(A) as a co-Chairperson of
- 2 the Commission. The majority leader of the Senate shall
- 3 designate 1 of the members appointed under subsection
- 4 (b)(1)(B) as a co-Chairperson of the Commission.
- 5 (e) Initial Meeting.—Not later than 60 days after
- 6 the date of enactment of this Act, the Commission shall
- 7 hold its first meeting.
- 8 (f) MEETINGS.—The Commission shall meet at the
- 9 call of either co-Chairperson.
- 10 (g) QUORUM.—A majority of the members of the
- 11 Commission shall constitute a quorum, but a lesser num-
- 12 ber of members may hold hearings.
- 13 SEC. 3. DUTIES OF THE COMMISSION.
- 14 (a) STUDY.—
- 15 (1) In General.—The Commission shall con-
- duct a thorough and thoughtful study of all matters
- 17 relating to increasing beneficiary-selected or bene-
- ficiary-directed options for social service delivery in
- 19 Federal social service programs, including certifi-
- 20 cate, scholarship, voucher, or other forms of indirect
- 21 delivery. The Commission shall review all relevant
- 22 Federal social service programs in existence on the
- date of the beginning of the study, including the ini-
- tiatives of the Corporation for National and Commu-
- 25 nity Service. The Commission shall determine pro-

- gram areas, among the Federal programs, for which it is appropriate and feasible to implement full or partial beneficiary-selected or beneficiary-directed options for the delivery of the social services.
 - (2) Goals.—In making determinations under paragraph (1), the Commission shall seek to promote goals of—
 - (A) expanding consumer and beneficiary choice in Federal social service programs;
 - (B) maximizing the use of governmental resources in the Federal programs; and
- 12 (C) minimizing concerns relating to any 13 precedent under the Constitution regarding the 14 participation of faith-based providers in the 15 Federal programs.
- 16 (b) Recommendations.—The Commission shall de-17 velop recommendations on program areas, among the Fed-18 eral social service programs, for which it is appropriate 19 and feasible to implement full or partial beneficiary-se-20 lected or beneficiary-directed options for the delivery of 21 the social services.
- 22 (c) Report.—Not later than 11 months after the 23 date of enactment of this Act, the Commission shall sub-24 mit a report to the Speaker and minority leader of the 25 House of Representatives and the majority leader and mi-

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- 1 nority leader of the Senate, which shall contain a detailed
- 2 statement of the findings and conclusions of the Commis-
- 3 sion, together with its recommendations for such legisla-
- 4 tion and administrative actions as it considers appro-
- 5 priate.

6 SEC. 4. POWERS OF THE COMMISSION.

- 7 (a) Hearings.—The Commission may hold such
- 8 hearings, sit and act at such times and places, take such
- 9 testimony, and receive such evidence as the Commission
- 10 considers necessary to carry out this Act.
- 11 (b) Information From Federal Agencies.—The
- 12 Commission may secure directly from any Federal depart-
- 13 ment or agency such information as the Commission con-
- 14 siders necessary to carry out this Act. Upon request of
- 15 either co-Chairperson of the Commission, the head of such
- 16 department or agency shall furnish such information to
- 17 the Commission.
- 18 (c) Postal Services.—The Commission may use
- 19 the United States mails in the same manner and under
- 20 the same conditions as other departments and agencies of
- 21 the Federal Government.

22 SEC. 5. COMMISSION PERSONNEL MATTERS.

- (a) Compensation of Members.—Each member of
- 24 the Commission who is not an officer or employee of the
- 25 Federal Government shall be compensated at a rate equal

- 1 to the daily equivalent of the annual rate of basic pay pre-
- 2 scribed for level IV of the Executive Schedule under sec-
- 3 tion 5315 of title 5, United States Code, for each day (in-
- 4 cluding travel time) during which such member is engaged
- 5 in the performance of the duties of the Commission. All
- 6 members of the Commission who are officers or employees
- 7 of the United States shall serve without compensation in
- 8 addition to that received for their services as officers or
- 9 employees of the United States.
- 10 (b) Travel Expenses.—The members of the Com-
- 11 mission shall be allowed travel expenses, including per
- 12 diem in lieu of subsistence, at rates authorized for employ-
- 13 ees of agencies under subchapter I of chapter 57 of title
- 14 5, United States Code, while away from their homes or
- 15 regular places of business in the performance of services
- 16 for the Commission.
- 17 (c) Staff.—
- 18 (1) IN GENERAL.—The co-Chairpersons of the
- 19 Commission, acting jointly, may, without regard to
- the civil service laws and regulations, appoint and
- 21 terminate an executive director and such other addi-
- 22 tional personnel as may be necessary to enable the
- Commission to perform its duties. The employment
- of an executive director shall be subject to confirma-
- 25 tion by the Commission.

- 1 (2) COMPENSATION.—The co-Chairpersons of 2 the Commission, acting jointly, may fix the com-3 pensation of the executive director and other per-4 sonnel without regard to chapter 51 and subchapter 5 III of chapter 53 of title 5, United States Code, re-
- 6 lating to classification of positions and General
- 7 Schedule pay rates, except that the rate of pay for
- 8 the executive director and other personnel may not
- 9 exceed the rate payable for level V of the Executive
- Schedule under section 5316 of such title.
- 11 (d) Detail of Government Employees.—Any
- 12 Federal Government employee may be detailed to the
- 13 Commission without reimbursement, and such detail shall
- 14 be without interruption or loss of civil service status or
- 15 privilege.
- 16 (e) Procurement of Temporary and Intermit-
- 17 Tent Services.—The co-Chairpersons of the Commis-
- 18 sion, acting jointly, may procure temporary and intermit-
- 19 tent services under section 3109(b) of title 5, United
- 20 States Code, at rates for individuals which do not exceed
- 21 the daily equivalent of the annual rate of basic pay pre-
- 22 scribed for level V of the Executive Schedule under section
- 23 5316 of such title.

1 SEC. 6. TERMINATION OF THE COMMISSION.

- 2 The Commission shall terminate 90 days after the
- 3 date on which the Commission submits its report under
- 4 section 3.

5 SEC. 7. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

- 6 (a) In General.—There are authorized to be appro-
- 7 priated to the Commission for fiscal year 2006 such sums
- 8 as may be necessary to carry out this Act.
- 9 (b) AVAILABILITY.—Any sums appropriated under
- 10 the authorization contained in this section shall remain
- 11 available, without fiscal year limitation, until expended.

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
