AN ACT

- To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a special resources study to evaluate resources along the coastal region of the State of Delaware and to determine the suitability and feasibility of establishing a unit of the National Park System in Delaware.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - ${\it 2\ tives\ of\ the\ United\ States\ of\ America\ in\ Congress\ assembled},$
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Delaware National
 - 5 Coastal Special Resources Study Act".

1 SEC. 2. STUDY.

- 2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Interior (re-
- 3 ferred to in this Act as the "Secretary") shall conduct a
- 4 special resources study of the national significance, suit-
- 5 ability, and feasibility of including sites in the coastal re-
- 6 gion of the State of Delaware in the National Park Sys-
- 7 tem.
- 8 (b) Inclusion of Sites in the National Park
- 9 System.—The study under subsection (a) shall include an
- 10 analysis and any recommendations of the Secretary con-
- 11 cerning the suitability and feasibility of designating 1 or
- 12 more of the sites along the Delaware coast, including Fort
- 13 Christina, as a unit of the National Park System that re-
- 14 lates to the themes described in section 3.
- (c) STUDY GUIDELINES.—In conducting the study
- 16 authorized under subsection (a), the Secretary shall use
- 17 the criteria for the study of areas for potential inclusion
- 18 in the National Park System contained in section 8 of
- 19 Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5).
- 20 (d) Consultation.—In preparing and conducting
- 21 the study under subsection (a), the Secretary shall consult
- 22 with—
- 23 (1) the State of Delaware;
- 24 (2) the coastal region communities; and
- 25 (3) the general public.

1 SEC. 3. THEMES.

2	The study authorized under section 2 shall evaluate
3	sites along the coastal region of the State of Delaware that
4	relate to—
5	(1) the history of indigenous peoples, which
6	would explore the history of Native American tribes
7	of Delaware, such as the Nanticoke and Lenni
8	Lenape;
9	(2) the colonization and establishment of the
10	frontier, which would chronicle the first European
11	settlers in the Delaware Valley who built fortifica-
12	tions for the protection of settlers, such as Fort
13	Christina;
14	(3) the founding of a nation, which would docu-
15	ment the contributions of Delaware to the develop-
16	ment of our constitutional republic;
17	(4) industrial development, which would inves-
18	tigate the exploitation of water power in Delaware
19	with the mill development on the Brandywine River;
20	(5) transportation, which would explore how
21	water served as the main transportation link, con-
22	necting Colonial Delaware with England, Europe,
23	and other colonies;
24	(6) coastal defense, which would document the
25	collection of fortifications spaced along the river and

- bay from Fort Delaware on Pea Patch Island to
 Fort Miles near Lewes;
- 3 (7) the last stop to freedom, which would detail 4 the role Delaware has played in the history of the
- Underground Railroad network; and

 (8) the coastal environment, which would examine natural resources of Delaware that provide resource-based recreational opportunities such as crabbing, fishing, swimming, and boating.

10 **SEC. 4. REPORT.**

- 11 Not later than 1 year after funds are made available
- 12 to carry out this Act under section 5, the Secretary shall
- 13 submit to the Committee on Energy and Natural Re-
- 14 sources of the Senate and the Committee on Resources
- 15 of the House of Representatives a report containing the
- 16 findings, conclusions, and recommendations of the study
- 17 conducted under section 2.

18 SEC. 5. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

- 19 There are authorized to be appropriated such sums
- 20 as are necessary to carry out this Act.
