# **AN ACT**

To provide relief for the victims of Hurricane Katrina.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

# **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Katrina Emergency5 Assistance Act of 2005".

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## 1 SEC. 2. UNEMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding section 410 of
3 the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency As4 sistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5177), in providing assistance
5 under that section to individuals unemployed as a result
6 of Hurricane Katrina—

7 (1) the President shall accept applications for
8 assistance during—

9 (A) the 90-day period beginning on the
10 date on which the applicable major disaster was
11 declared; or

12 (B) such longer period as may be estab-13 lished by the President; and

(2) subject to subsection (b), the President
shall provide assistance to any unemployed individual, to the extent the individual is not entitled to
unemployment compensation under any Federal or
State law, until that individual is reemployed in a
suitable position.

(b) LIMITATION FOR PERIOD OF ASSISTANCE.—The
total amount of assistance payable to an individual under
subsection (a) may not exceed payments based on a 39week period of unemployment.

## 24 SEC. 3. REIMBURSEMENT FOR PURCHASES.

25 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

(1) DISASTER PERIOD.—The term "disaster pe-1 2 riod" means, with respect to any State that includes an area for which a major disaster has been declared 3 4 in accordance with section 401 of the Robert T. 5 Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance 6 Act (42 U.S.C. 5170) as a result of Hurricane 7 Katrina or Hurricane Rita, the period beginning on 8 the earliest date on which any area of the State was 9 so declared and ending on the latest date for which 10 any such declaration of an area of the State termi-11 nates. 12 (2) KATRINA OR RITA SURVIVOR.—The term "Katrina or Rita Survivor" means an individual 13 14 who----15 (A) resides in an area for which a major 16 disaster has been declared in accordance with 17 401 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief 18 and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 19 5170) as a result of Hurricane Katrina or Hur-20 ricane Rita; or 21 (B) resided in an area described in sub-22 paragraph (A) during the 7 days immediately 23 preceding the date of declaration of a major 24 disaster described in subparagraph (A).

1	(3) MAJOR DISASTER.—The term "major dis-
2	aster" has the meaning given the term in section
3	102 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and
4	Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5122).
5	(b) Reimbursement.—
6	(1) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other
7	provision of law, the President may reimburse a
8	community for each purchase of supplies (such as
9	food, personal hygiene products, linens, and cloth-
10	ing) distributed to Katrina or Rita Survivors.
11	(2) ELIGIBLE PURCHASES.—Reimbursement
12	under paragraph (1) shall be available only with re-
13	spect to supplies that—
14	(A) are purchased with taxpayer dollars;
15	and
16	(B) would otherwise be eligible for reim-
17	bursement if purchased by a Katrina or Rita
18	Survivor.
19	(c) PERIOD OF APPLICABILITY.—This section and
20	the authority provided by this section apply only to a com-
21	munity assisting Katrina or Rita Survivors from a State
22	during the disaster period of the State.

3 It is the sense of Congress that the Bureau of Immi-4 gration and Customs Enforcement within the Department 5 of Homeland Security should suspend or refrain from ini-6 tiating removal proceedings for international students and 7 scholars who are deportable solely due to their inability 8 to fulfill the terms of their visas as a result of a national 9 disaster, such as Hurricane Katrina.

## 10 SEC. 5. CONTRACTING AUTHORITY.

11 Not later than 90 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Homeland Security, acting 12 13 through the Under Secretary for Emergency Preparedness, shall propose new inspection guidelines that prohibit 14 an inspector from entering into a contract with any indi-15 16 vidual or entity for whom the inspector performs an inspection for purposes of determining eligibility for assist-17 ance from the Federal Emergency Management Agency. 18 Passed the Senate February 15, 2006.
