# AN ACT

- To provide assistance to the State of New Mexico for the development of comprehensive State water plans, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "New Mexico Water
- 5 Planning Assistance Act".

#### 1 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.

2 In this Act:

3 (1) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means 4 the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Bu-5 reau of Reclamation and the United States Geologi-6 cal Survey. (2) STATE.—The term "State" means the State 7 8 of New Mexico. SEC. 3. COMPREHENSIVE WATER PLAN ASSISTANCE. 9 (a) IN GENERAL.—Upon the request of the Governor 10 of the State and subject to subsections (b) through (f), 11 the Secretary shall— 12 13 (1) provide to the State technical assistance

and grants for the development of comprehensive
State water plans;

16 (2) conduct water resources mapping in the17 State; and

(3) conduct a comprehensive study of groundwater resources (including potable, brackish, and saline water resources) in the State to assess the
quantity, quality, and interaction of groundwater
and surface water resources.

23 (b) TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE.—Technical assistance
24 provided under subsection (a) may include—

1	(1) acquisition of hydrologic data, groundwater
2	characterization, database development, and data
3	distribution;
4	(2) expansion of climate, surface water, and
5	groundwater monitoring networks;
6	(3) assessment of existing water resources, sur-
7	face water storage, and groundwater storage poten-
8	tial;
9	(4) numerical analysis and modeling necessary
10	to provide an integrated understanding of water re-
11	sources and water management options;
12	(5) participation in State planning forums and
13	planning groups;
14	(6) coordination of Federal water management
15	planning efforts;
16	(7) technical review of data, models, planning
17	scenarios, and water plans developed by the State;
18	and
19	(8) provision of scientific and technical special-
20	ists to support State and local activities.
21	(c) Allocation.—In providing grants under sub-
22	section (a), the Secretary shall, subject to the availability
23	of appropriations, allocate—
24	(1) \$5,000,000 to develop hydrologic models
25	and acquire associated equipment for the New Mex-

1 ico Rio Grande main stem sections and Rios Pueblo 2 de Taos and Hondo, Rios Nambe, Pojoaque and 3 Teseque, Rio Chama, and Lower Rio Grande tribu-4 taries; (2) \$1,500,000 to complete the hydrographic 5 6 survey development of hydrologic models and acquire 7 associated equipment for the San Juan River and 8 tributaries; 9 (3) \$1,000,000 to complete the hydrographic 10 survey development of hydrologic models and acquire 11 associated equipment for Southwest New Mexico, in-12 cluding the Animas Basin, the Gila River, and tribu-13 taries: 14 \$4,500,000 (4)for statewide digital 15 orthophotography mapping; and 16 (5) such sums as are necessary to carry out ad-17 ditional projects consistent with subsection (b). 18 (d) COST-SHARING REQUIREMENT.— 19 (1) IN GENERAL.—The non-Federal share of 20 the total cost of any activity carried out using a 21 grant provided under subsection (a) shall be 50 per-22 cent. 23 (2) FORM OF NON-FEDERAL SHARE.—The non-24 Federal share under paragraph (1) may be in the 25 form of any in-kind services that the Secretary determines would contribute substantially toward the
 conduct and completion of the activity assisted.

3 (e) NON-REIMBURSABLE BASIS.—Any assistance or
4 grants provided to the State under this Act shall be made
5 on a non-reimbursable basis.

6 (f) AUTHORIZED TRANSFERS.—On request of the
7 State, the Secretary shall directly transfer to 1 or more
8 Federal agencies any amounts made available to the State
9 to carry out this Act.

#### 10 SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

There is authorized to be appropriated to carry out
this Act \$3,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2006 through
2010.
