A BILL

To amend the Trade Act of 1974 to extend trade benefits to certain tents imported into the United States.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. DUTY-FREE TREATMENT FOR CERTAIN TENTS.**

4 (a) ARTICLES NOT DESIGNATED AS SENSITIVE.—

5 Section 503(b) (19 U.S.C. 2463(b)) of the Trade Act of
6 1974 is amended—

7 (1) in paragraph (1)(A), by inserting “and,

8 with respect to countries designated under section

9 503(a)(1)(B), paragraph (5),” after “paragraph

10 (4)”;

1 (2) by adding at the end the following new
2 paragraph:

3 “(5) CERTAIN TENTS.—Notwithstanding para-
4 graph (1)(A), the President may designate as an eli-
5 gible article or articles under subsection (a) certain
6 tents with a sewn in floor and base size less than
7 6.096 meters by 6.096 meters classifiable under sub-
8 heading 6306.22.90 of the Harmonized Tariff
9 Schedule of the United States.”.

10 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
11 subsection (a) shall apply to any article entered, or with-
12 drawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after the
13 date on which the President makes a designation with re-
14 spect to the article under section 503(b)(5) of the Trade
15 Act of 1974, as added by subsection (a).
