6 SEC. 2. ROYALTY RELIEF FOR PRODUCTION OF OIL AND 7 GAS.

8 (a) PRICE THRESHOLDS.—Notwithstanding any9 other provision of law, the Secretary of the Interior (re-

ferred to in this Act as the "Secretary") shall place limita tions based on market price on the royalty relief granted
under any lease for the production of oil or natural gas
on Federal land (including submerged land) entered into
by the Secretary on or after the date of enactment of this
Act.

7 (b) CLARIFICATION OF AUTHORITY TO IMPOSE 8 PRICE THRESHOLDS FOR CERTAIN LEASE SALES.—Con-9 gress reaffirms the authority of the Secretary under section 8(a)(1)(H) of the Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act 10 11 (43 U.S.C. 1337(a)(1)(H)) to vary, based on the price of 12 production from a lease, the suspension of royalties under 13 any lease subject to section 304 of the Outer Continental 14 Shelf Deep Water Royalty Relief Act (Public Law 104– 15 58; 43 U.S.C. 1337 note).

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
