To provide for the extension of preliminary permit periods by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission for certain hydroelectric projects in the State of Alaska.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF PRELIMINARY PERMIT PERI
ODS.

(a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

(1) COMMISSION.—The term "Commission"

means the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission.

(2) THOMAS BAY PROJECT.—The term "Thom-

as Bay project" means—

1	(A) the hydroelectric project of the Com-
2	mission at Cascade Creek, Alaska, preliminary
3	permit number 12495, dated October 8, 2004;
4	(B) the hydroelectric project of the Com-
5	mission at Ruth Lake, Alaska, preliminary per-
6	mit number 12619, dated February 23, 2006;
7	and
8	(C) the hydroelectric project of the Com-
9	mission at Scenery Lake, Alaska, preliminary
10	permit number 12621, dated February 23,
11	2006.
12	(b) Extension.—Notwithstanding section 5 of the
13	Federal Power Act (16 U.S.C. 798) or any other provision
14	of law (including regulations), on receipt of a request from
15	the preliminary permit holder of a Thomas Bay project
16	and after providing reasonable notice, the Commission
17	may extend the period of the preliminary permit for the
18	Thomas Bay project for not more than 2 consecutive 3-
19	year periods following the expiration of the initial prelimi-
20	nary permit for the Thomas Bay project, in accordance
21	with applicable procedures of the Commission.
