### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Textile Negotiator Pro-

#### 6 SEC. 2. CHIEF TEXTILES NEGOTIATOR.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 141 of the Trade Act of
8 1974 (19 U.S.C. 2171) is amended—

1	(1) in subsection $(b)(2)$ —
2	(A) by striking "and one Chief Agricul-
3	tural Negotiator" and inserting ", one Chief
4	Agricultural Negotiator, and one Chief Textiles
5	Negotiator";
6	(B) by striking "or the Chief Agricultural
7	Negotiator" and inserting ", the Chief Agricul-
8	tural Negotiator, or the Chief Textiles Nego-
9	tiator"; and
10	(C) by striking "and the Chief Agricultural
11	Negotiator" and inserting ", the Chief Agricul-
12	tural Negotiator, and the Chief Textiles Nego-
13	tiator"; and
14	(2) in subsection (c), by adding at the end the
15	following new paragraph:
16	"(6) The principal function of the Chief Tex-
17	tiles Negotiator shall be to conduct trade negotia-
18	tions and to enforce trade agreements relating to
19	United States textile and apparel products and serv-
20	ices. The Chief Textiles Negotiator shall be a vig-
21	orous advocate on behalf of United States textile
22	and apparel interests. The Chief Textiles Negotiator
23	shall perform such other functions as the United
24	States Trade Representative may direct.".
25	(b) Effective Date; Continuation in Office.—

(1) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made
 by this section shall take effect on the date of the
 enactment of this Act.

4 (2) CONTINUATION IN OFFICE.—The individual 5 serving as Special Textile Negotiator of the United States Trade Representative on the day before the 6 date of the enactment of this Act may serve in the 7 Chief Textiles Negotiator position established pursu-8 9 ant to subsection (a) as Acting Chief Textiles Nego-10 tiator until the date that an individual nominated to 11 such position by the President is confirmed by the United States Senate. 12
