3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Barrier Project Con-5 solidation and Construction Act of 2006".

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1 SEC. 2. CONSOLIDATION OF BARRIER PROJECTS.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Chicago Sanitary and Ship 2 3 Canal Dispersal Barrier Project (referred to in this Act 4 as "Barrier I") (as in existence on the date of enactment 5 of this Act), constructed as a demonstration project under section 1202(i)(3) of the Nonindigenous Aquatic Nuisance 6 7 Prevention and Control Act of 1990 (16)U.S.C. 8 4722(i)(3), and the project relating to the Chicago Sanitary and Ship Canal Dispersal Barrier, as authorized by 9 section 345 of the District of Columbia Appropriations 10 Act, 2005 (Public Law 108-335; 118 Stat. 1352) (re-11 ferred to in this Act as "Barrier II"), shall be considered 12 13 to constitute a single project to prevent the spread of 14 aquatic nuisance species.

10	(2) Application of credit.—A State may
11	apply a credit received under paragraph $(1)(E)$ to
12	any cost-sharing responsibility for an existing or fu-
13	ture Federal project with the Corps of Engineers in
14	the State.
15	(c) FEASIBILITY STUDY.—The Secretary, in con-
16	sultation with appropriate Federal, State, local, and non-
17	governmental entities, shall conduct a feasibility study, at
18	full Federal expense, of the range of options and tech-
19	nologies available to prevent the spread of aquatic nui-
20	sance species between the Great Lakes and Mississippi
21	River Basins through the Chicago Sanitary and Ship
22	Canal and other aquatic pathways.
23	(d) Conforming Amendment.—Section 345 of the
24	District of Columbia Appropriations Act, 2005 (Public

1 Law 108–335; 118 Stat. 1352) is amended to read as fol-2 lows:

3 "SEC. 345. There are authorized to be appropriated
4 such sums as are necessary to carry out the Barrier II
5 project of the project for the Chicago Sanitary and Ship
6 Canal Dispersal Barrier, Illinois, initiated pursuant to sec7 tion 1135 of the Water Resources Development Act of
8 1986 (33 U.S.C. 2309a).".

9 SEC. 3. LAKE CHAMPLAIN CANAL STUDY, VERMONT AND 10 NEW YORK.

11 (a) DISPERSAL BARRIER PROJECT.—The Secretary 12 shall determine, at full Federal expense, the feasibility of a dispersal barrier project at the Lake Champlain Canal. 13 14 (b) CONSTRUCTION, MAINTENANCE, AND OPER-15 ATION.—If the Secretary determines that the project de-16 scribed in subsection (a) is feasible, the Secretary shall 17 construct, maintain, and operate a dispersal barrier at the Lake Champlain Canal at full Federal expense. 18

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
