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## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the District of Columbia Special Olympics Law Enforcement Torch Run.

1       *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*  
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF USE OF CAPITOL**  
4                   **GROUNDS FOR D.C. SPECIAL OLYMPICS LAW**  
5                   **ENFORCEMENT TORCH RUN.**

6       On June 8, 2007, or on such other date as the Speak-  
7 er of the House of Representatives and the Committee on  
8 Rules and Administration of the Senate may jointly des-

1 ignate, the 2007 District of Columbia Special Olympics  
2 Law Enforcement Torch Run (in this resolution referred  
3 to as the “event”) may be run through the Capitol  
4 Grounds as part of the journey of the Special Olympics  
5 torch to the District of Columbia Special Olympics sum-  
6 mer games.

7 **SEC. 2. RESPONSIBILITY OF CAPITOL POLICE BOARD.**

8 The Capitol Police Board shall take such actions as  
9 may be necessary to carry out the event.

10 **SEC. 3. CONDITIONS RELATING TO PHYSICAL PREPARA-**  
11 **TIONS.**

12 The Architect of the Capitol may prescribe conditions  
13 for physical preparations for the event.

14 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

15 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-  
16 ment of the restrictions contained in section 5104(c) of  
17 title 40, United States Code, concerning sales, advertise-  
18 ments, displays, and solicitations on the Capitol Grounds,

1 as well as other restrictions applicable to the Capitol  
2 Grounds, in connection with the event.
