CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing printing of the brochure entitled “How Our Laws Are Made”, the document-sized, annotated version of the United States Constitution, and the pocket version of the United States Constitution.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. HOW OUR LAWS ARE MADE.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—An edition of the brochure enti-
5 tled “How Our Laws Are Made”, as revised under the di-
6 rection of the Parliamentarian of the House of Represent-

1 atives in consultation with the Parliamentarian of the Sen-
2 ate, shall be printed as a House document under the direc-
3 tion of the Joint Committee on Printing.

4 (b) ADDITIONAL COPIES.—In addition to the usual
5 number, there shall be printed the lesser of—

6 (1) 550,000 copies of the document, of which
7 440,000 copies shall be for the use of the House of
8 Representatives, 100,000 copies shall be for the use
9 of the Senate, and 10,000 copies shall be for the use
10 of the Joint Committee on Printing; or

11 (2) such number of copies of the document as
12 does not exceed a total production and printing cost
13 of \$479,247, with distribution to be allocated in the
14 same proportion as described in paragraph (1), ex-
15 cept that in no case shall the number of copies be
16 less than 1 per Member of Congress.

17 **SEC. 2. DOCUMENT-SIZED, ANNOTATED UNITED STATES**
18 **CONSTITUTION.**

19 (a) IN GENERAL.—The 2007 edition of the docu-
20 ment-sized, annotated version of the United States Con-
21 stitution shall be printed as a House document under the
22 direction of the Joint Committee on Printing.

23 (b) ADDITIONAL COPIES.—In addition to the usual
24 number, there shall be printed the lesser of—

1 (1) 550,000 copies of the document, of which
2 440,000 copies shall be for the use of the House of
3 Representatives, 100,000 copies shall be for the use
4 of the Senate, and 10,000 copies shall be for the use
5 of the Joint Committee on Printing; or

6 (2) such number of copies of the document as
7 does not exceed a total production and printing cost
8 of \$535,853, with distribution to be allocated in the
9 same proportion as described in paragraph (1), ex-
10 cept that in no case shall the number of copies be
11 less than 1 per Member of Congress.

12 **SEC. 3. POCKET VERSION OF THE UNITED STATES CON-**
13 **STITUTION.**

14 (a) IN GENERAL.—The 23rd edition of the pocket
15 version of the United States Constitution shall be printed
16 as a House document under the direction of the Joint
17 Committee on Printing.

18 (b) ADDITIONAL COPIES.—In addition to the usual
19 number, there shall be printed the lesser of—

20 (1) 550,000 copies of the document, of which
21 440,000 copies shall be for the use of the House of
22 Representatives, 100,000 copies shall be for the use
23 of the Senate, and 10,000 copies shall be for the use
24 of the Joint Committee on Printing; or

1 (2) such number of copies of the document as
2 does not exceed a total production and printing cost
3 of \$188,462, with distribution to be allocated in the
4 same proportion as described in paragraph (1), ex-
5 cept that in no case shall the number of copies be
6 less than 1 per Member of Congress.
