CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Supporting the efforts of the Iraq Neighbors Process Ministerial meeting and encouraging the ongoing engagement of the international community to stabilize Iraq and achieve peace in the Middle East.

Whereas, on November 2–3, 2007, the Iraq Neighbors Process Ministerial meeting will convene for its second meeting in Istanbul, Turkey, involving ministers from countries in the Middle East, as well as the United States, the European Union, and the United Nations;

Whereas the United States enjoys important friendships with its allies in the Middle East;

Whereas fostering stability in Iraq and in the Middle East as a whole is a shared priority for the United States and its allies around the world; and

Whereas increased dialogue is a critical step in improving relations between Iraq and its neighboring countries: Now, therefore, be it
