Mr. KUHLMAN of New York introduced the following joint resolution; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to limit the number of times Senators and Representatives may be elected.

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled*
3 *(two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-*
4 *lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-*
5 *stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all*
6 *intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when*
7 *ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several*
8 *States within seven years after the date of its submission*
9 *for ratification:*

1 "ARTICLE —

2 "SECTION 1. No person shall be elected as a Rep-
3 resentative more than six times. An election to any part
4 of a term for which some other person was elected shall
5 not count in determining the number of times a person
6 is elected.

7 "SECTION 2. No person shall be elected or appointed
8 as a Senator more than twice. An election or appointment
9 to any part of a term for which some other person was
10 elected shall not count in determining the number of times
11 a person is elected or appointed.

12 "SECTION 3. Only elections or appointments which
13 occur after the date of ratification of this article shall
14 count in determining the number of times a person is
15 elected or appointed."
