AN ACT

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study to determine the suitability and feasibility of designating the Soldiers' Memorial Military Museum located in St. Louis, Missouri, as a unit of the National Park System.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. NATIONAL PARK SERVICE STUDY REGARDING
- 4 THE SOLDIERS' MEMORIAL MILITARY MU-
- 5 SEUM.
- 6 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds as follows:

- 1 (1) The Soldiers' Memorial is a tribute to all 2 veterans located in the greater St. Louis area, in-3 cluding Southern Illinois.
- 4 (2) The current annual budget for the memorial 5 is \$185,000 and is paid for exclusively by the City 6 of St. Louis.
- 7 (3) In 1923, the City of St. Louis voted to 8 spend \$6,000,000 to purchase a memorial plaza and 9 building dedicated to citizens of St. Louis who lost their lives in World War I.
 - (4) The purchase of the 7 block site exhausted the funds and no money remained to construct a monument.
- 14 (5) In 1933, Mayor Bernard F. Dickmann appealed to citizens and the city government to raise \$1,000,000 to construct a memorial building and general improvement of the plaza area and the construction of Soldiers' Memorial began on October 21, 1935.
- 20 (6) On October 14, 1936, President Franklin
 21 D. Roosevelt officially dedicated the site.
- 22 (7) On Memorial Day in 1938, Mayor 23 Dickmann opened the building to the public.
- 24 (b) STUDY.—The Secretary of the Interior shall carry 25 out a study to determine the suitability and feasibility of

- 4 (c) STUDY PROCESS AND COMPLETION.—Section
- 5 8(c) of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5(c)) shall
- 6 apply to the conduct and completion of the study required
- 7 by this section.
- 8 (d) Report.—The Secretary shall submit a report
- 9 describing the results the study required by this section
- 10 to the Committee on Natural Resources of the House of
- 11 Representatives and the Committee on Energy and Nat-
- 12 ural Resources of the Senate.
