1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- This Act may be cited as the "Candidate Anti-Cor-
- 3 ruption Act".
- 4 SEC. 2. PROHIBITING USE OF CONTRIBUTIONS AND DONA-
- 5 TIONS FOR SALARIES OF CANDIDATES OR OF-
- 6 FICEHOLDERS.
- 7 (a) In General.—Section 313(b)(2) of the Federal
- 8 Election Campaign Act of 1971 (2 U.S.C. 439a(b)(2)) is
- 9 amended by striking "is used to" and inserting "is used
- 10 for the payment of a salary to the candidate or individual
- 11 involved or to any member of the immediate family of the
- 12 candidate or individual involved, or is used to".
- 13 (b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
- 14 subsection (a) shall take effect as if included in the enact-
- 15 ment of the Bipartisan Campaign Reform Act of 2002,
- 16 except that the amendment shall not apply with respect
- 17 to any payment of a salary which is made prior to the
- 18 expiration of the 60-day period which begins on the date
- 19 of the enactment of this Act.
