A BILL

To amend the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 to prohibit the use of any contribution made to a candidate for election for Federal office, or any donation made to an individual as support for the individual's activities as the holder of a Federal office, for the payment of a salary to the candidate or individual or to any member of the immediate family of the candidate or individual.

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Candidate Anti-Cor-
3 ruption Act”.

4 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITING USE OF CONTRIBUTIONS AND DONA-
5 TIONS FOR SALARIES OF CANDIDATES OR OF-
6 FICEHOLDERS.**

7 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Section 313(b)(2) of the Federal
8 Election Campaign Act of 1971 (2 U.S.C. 439a(b)(2)) is
9 amended by striking “is used to” and inserting “is used
10 for the payment of a salary to the candidate or individual
11 involved or to any member of the immediate family of the
12 candidate or individual involved, or is used to”.

13 (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendment made by
14 subsection (a) shall take effect as if included in the enact-
15 ment of the Bipartisan Campaign Reform Act of 2002,
16 except that the amendment shall not apply with respect
17 to any payment of a salary which is made prior to the
18 expiration of the 60-day period which begins on the date
19 of the enactment of this Act.
