AN ACT

To require the Secretary of State to submit to Congress a report on efforts to bring to justice the Palestinian terrorists who killed John Branchizio, Mark Parson, and John Marin Linde.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1	SECTION 1. REPORT RELATING TO THE MURDERS OF JOHN
2	BRANCHIZIO, MARK PARSON, AND JOHN
3	MARIN LINDE.
4	(a) Findings.—Congress makes the following find-
5	ings:
6	(1) On October 15, 2003, a convoy of clearly
7	identified United States diplomatic vehicles was at-
8	tacked by Palestinian terrorists in Gaza resulting in
9	the deaths of John Branchizio, Mark Parson, and
10	John Marin Linde, and the injury of a fourth Amer-
11	ican.
12	(2) John Branchizio, Mark Parson, and John
13	Marin Linde were contract employees providing se-
14	curity to United States diplomatic personnel who
15	were visiting Gaza in order to identify potential Pal-
16	estinian candidates for scholarships under the Ful-
17	bright Program.
18	(3) Senior officials of the Palestinian Authority
19	have stated that they were aware of the identities of
20	the Palestinian terrorists who killed John
21	Branchizio, Mark Parson, and John Marin Linde.
22	(4) Following her visit to Israel and the West
23	Bank on February 7, 2005, Secretary of State
24	Condoleezza Rice announced that she had been "as-
25	sured by President Abbas of the Palestinian

Authority's intention to bring justice to those who

- 1 murdered three American personnel in the Gaza in 2003".
- (5) Since the bombing on October 15, 2003,
 United States Government personnel have been prohibited from all travel in Gaza.
 - (6) The United States Rewards for Justice program is offering a reward of up to \$5,000,000 for information leading to the arrest or conviction of any persons involved in the murders of John Branchizio, Mark Parson, and John Marin Linde.
- 11 (7) The Palestinian terrorists who killed John 12 Branchizio, Mark Parson, and John Marin Linde 13 have still not been brought to justice.
- 14 (b) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of Con-15 gress that—
- 16 (1) the continued inability or unwillingness of 17 the Palestinian Authority to actively and aggres-18 sively pursue the Palestinian terrorists who killed 19 John Branchizio, Mark Parson, and John Marin 20 Linde and bring them to justice calls into question 21 the Palestinian Authority's suitability as a partner 22 for the United States in diplomatic efforts to resolve 23 the Palestinian-Israeli conflict;
- 24 (2) future United States assistance to the Pal-25 estinian Authority may be suspended or conditioned,

and the continued operation of the PLO Representative Office in Washington may be jeopardized, if the Palestinian Authority does not fully and effectively cooperate in bringing to justice the Palestinian terrorists who killed John Branchizio, Mark Parson,

and John Marin Linde; and

- 7 (3) it is in the vital national security interest of 8 the United States to safeguard, to the greatest ex-9 tent possible consistent with their mission, United 10 States diplomats and all embassy and consulate per-11 sonnel, and to use the full power of the United 12 States to bring to justice any individual or entity 13 that threatens, jeopardizes, or harms them.
- 14 (c) Report.—Not later than 30 days after the date 15 of the enactment of this Act, and every 120 days there16 after, the Secretary of State shall submit a report, on a 17 classified basis if necessary, to the appropriate congres18 sional committees describing—
- 19 (1) efforts by the United States to bring to jus-20 tice the Palestinian terrorists who killed John 21 Branchizio, Mark Parson, and John Marin Linde;
 - (2) a detailed assessment of efforts by the Palestinian Authority to bring to justice the Palestinian terrorists who killed John Branchizio, Mark Parson, and John Marin Linde, including—

1	(A) the number of arrests, interrogations,
2	and interviews by Palestinian Authority officials
3	related to the case;
4	(B) the number of Palestinian security
5	personnel and man-hours assigned to the case;
6	(C) the extent of personal supervision or
7	involvement by the President and Ministers of
8	the Palestinian Authority; and
9	(D) the degree of cooperation between the
10	United States and the Palestinian Authority in
11	regards to this case;
12	(3) a specific assessment by the Secretary of
13	whether the Palestinian efforts described in para-
14	graph (2) constitute the best possible effort by the
15	Palestinian Authority; and
16	(4) any additional steps or initiatives requested
17	or recommended by the United States that were not
18	pursued by the Palestinian Authority.
19	(d) CERTIFICATION.—The requirement to submit a
20	report under subsection (c) shall no longer apply if the
21	Secretary of State certifies to the appropriate congres-
22	sional committees that the Palestinian terrorists who
23	killed John Branchizio, Mark Parson, and John Marin
24	Linde have been identified, arrested, and brought to jus-
25	tice.

1	(e) Definition.—In this section, the term "appro-					
2	priate congressional committees" means—					
3	(1) the Committee on Foreign Affairs and the					
4	Committee on Appropriations of the House of Rep-					
5	resentatives; and					
6	(2) the Committee on Foreign Relations and					
7	the Committee on Appropriations of the Senate.
