A BILL

- To prohibit the sale of certain inefficient light bulbs, and require the development of a plan for increasing the use of more efficient light bulbs by consumers and businesses.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Leveraging Innovative
 - 5 Gains in High-efficiency Technology (LIGHT) Bulbs Act
 - 6 of 2007".

1 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION.

2 (a) REGULATIONS.—Not later than 1 year after the
3 date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Energy
4 shall issue regulations—

5 (1) prohibiting the sale of light bulbs that emit
6 less than 25 lumens per watt, effective January 1,
7 2010;

8 (2) prohibiting the sale of light bulbs that emit
9 less than 60 lumens per watt, effective January 1,
10 2015; and

11 (b) EXEMPTIONS.—The regulations issued under 12 subsection (a) shall include procedures for the Secretary 13 to provide exemptions to the prohibition. The Secretary may provide such an exemption only in cases where the 14 Secretary finds, after a hearing and opportunity for public 15 16 comment, that it is not technically feasible to serve a spe-17 cialized lighting application, such as a military, medical, 18 public safety application, or in certified historic lighting 19 applications using bulbs that meet the requirements of 20subsection (a). Exemptions provided under this subsection 21 shall expire after 2 years. No exemption may be provided 22 under this subsection for general illumination applications.

(c) CIVIL PENALTY.—The Secretary of Energy shall
include in regulations under this section a schedule of appropriate civil penalties for violations of the prohibition

under this section. Such penalties shall be in an amount
 sufficient to ensure compliance with this Act.

3 (d) DEFINITION.—For purposes of this Act, the term
4 "general illumination" means lighting designed to provide
5 a substantially uniform level of luminance throughout an
6 area exclusive of any provision for special or local require7 ments.

8 SEC. 3. PLAN.

9 Not later than 6 months after the date of enactment
10 of this Act, the Secretary of Energy shall transmit to the
11 Congress a plan for encouraging and providing incentives
12 for the domestic production of more efficient light bulbs
13 by U.S. manufacturers.

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
