# A BILL

To amend the National Manufactured Housing Construction and Safety Standards Act of 1974 to require that weather radios be installed in all manufactured homes manufactured or sold in the United States.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. 3 4 This Act may be cited as the "CJ's Home Protection" 5 Act of 2007". SEC. 2. CONGRESSIONAL FINDINGS. 7 The Congress finds that— 8 (1) nearly 20,000,000 Americans live in manu-9 factured homes, which often provide a more accessible 10 and affordable way for many families to buy their 11 own homes: 12 (2) manufactured housing plays a vital role in 13 providing housing for low- and moderate-income fam-14 ilies in the United States: 15 (3) NOAA Weather Radio (NWR) is a nation-16 wide network of radio stations broadcasting contin-17 uous weather information directly from a nearby National Weather Service (NWS) office, and broadcasts 18 19 NWS warnings, watches, forecasts, and other all-haz-20 ard information 24 hours a day; 21 (4) the operators of manufactured housing com-22 munities should be encouraged to provide a safe place 23 of shelter for community residents or a plan for the

evacuation of community residents to a safe place of

- 1 shelter within a reasonable distance of the community 2 for use by community residents in times of severe weather, including tornados and high winds, and 3 local municipalities should be encouraged to require approval of these plans; 5 6 (5) the operators of manufactured housing com-7 munities should be encouraged to provide a written 8 reminder semiannually to all owners of manufactured 9 homes in the manufactured housing community to replace the batteries in their weather radios; and 10 11 (6) weather radio manufacturers should include, 12 in the packaging of weather radios, a written re-13 minder to replace the batteries twice each year and 14 written instructions on how to do so. 15 SEC. 3. FEDERAL MANUFACTURED HOME CONSTRUCTION 16 AND SAFETY STANDARD. 17 Section 604 of the National Manufactured Housing Construction and Safety Standards Act of 1974 (42 U.S.C. 18 19 5403) is amended by adding at the end the following new
- 21 "(i) Weather Radios.—
- "(1) Construction and safety standards established by the Secretary under
  this section shall require that each manufactured

subsection:

1	home delivered for sale shall be supplied with a
2	weather radio inside the manufactured home that—
3	"(A) is capable of broadcasting emergency
4	information relating to local weather conditions;
5	"(B) is equipped with a tone alarm;
6	"(C) is equipped with Specific Alert Mes-
7	sage Encoding, or SAME technology; and
8	"(D) complies with Consumer Electronics
9	Association (CEA) Standard 2009–A (or current
10	revision thereof) Performance Specification for
11	Public Alert Receivers.
12	"(2) Liability protections.—
13	"(A) No aspect of the function, operation,
14	performance, capabilities, or utilization of the
15	weather radio required under this subsection, or
16	any instructions related thereto, shall be subject
17	to the requirements of section 613 or 615 or any
18	regulations promulgated by the Secretary pursu-
19	ant to the authority under such sections.
20	"(B) Manufacturers of manufactured homes,
21	as such term is defined in section 603, shall be
22	immune from common law civil liability for any
23	aspect of the function, operation, performance,
24	capabilities, or utilization of the weather radio
25	receiver mandated by the Federal manufactured

home construction and safety standard promul gated in accordance with this subsection, includ ing any instructions related thereto.

"(C) Any reminder, assistance, or instructions provided by the operator of a manufactured housing community concerning the function of a weather radio contained in a manufactured home shall not subject the operator, an owner or employee of the manufactured home community, or the manufacturer of the manufactured home to liability for the functionality of that weather radio.".

## 13 SEC. 4. ESTABLISHMENT.

14 Not later than the expiration of the 90-day period be-15 ginning on the date of the enactment of this Act, the consensus committee established pursuant to section 604(a)(3)16 of the National Manufactured Housing Construction and Safety Standards Act of 1974 (42 U.S.C. 5304(a)(3)) shall 18 develop and submit to the Secretary of Housing and Urban 19 Development a proposed Federal manufactured home con-20 21 struction and safety standard required under section 604(i) of such Act (as added by the amendment made by section 3 of this Act). Notwithstanding section 604(a)(5)(B) of such Act, the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development shall issue a final order promulgating the standard required by

- 1 such section 604(i) not later than the expiration of the 90-
- 2 day period beginning upon receipt by the Secretary of the
- 3 proposed standard developed and submitted by the con-
- 4 sensus committee.

### 5 SEC. 5. STUDY.

- 6 The Secretary of Housing and Urban Development
- 7 shall conduct of study regarding conditioning the applica-
- 8 bility of the requirement under the amendment made by
- 9 section 3 of this Act (relating to supplying weather radios
- 10 in manufactured homes) on the geographic location at
- 11 which a manufactured home is placed, but only to the extent
- 12 that such requirement applies to new manufactured homes
- 13 and new site-built homes. In conducting such study and
- 14 making determinations under to the study, the Secretary
- 15 shall take into consideration severe weather conditions, such
- 16 as high winds and flooding, and wind zones and other se-
- 17 vere weather data available from the National Weather
- 18 Service. Not later than the expiration of the 18-month pe-
- 19 riod beginning on the date of the enactment of this Act,
- 20 the Secretary shall complete the study and submit a report
- 21 regarding the results of the study to the Committee on Fi-
- 22 nancial Services of the House of Representatives and to the
- 23 Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs of the
- 24 Senate.
